JANUARY 1 (GENESIS 1, MATTHEW 1)

God of all creation, what a marvelous and majestic God you must be – beyond what my mind can comprehend! The heavens declare your glory – through the day with blazing sun and billowing clouds, through the night with the reflecting moon and the shining stars you cause to appear and call by name. Rustling leaves and rippling brooks, grand mountains and glorious beaches, fragile flowers and enormous elephants display the goodness of your creative power all around us ... Praise your name! May we never stop at observing the creation but always marvel at its Creator, who made us and placed us here to reflect your image in every corner of your creation. O may we be faithful today to do so because we find nothing so wonderfully glorious as your image! Thank you for making us. Thank you for saving us through your Son, Jesus. Thank you for being with us now and forever, our God, Immanuel. Amen.

JANUARY 2 (GENESIS 2, MATTHEW 2)

Jesus, our Creator, our Savior, and our King, we join the wise men in bowing before you in worship, in proclaiming you are worthy of our time and attention throughout this day, in bringing our best gifts – all our time, talents, and treasure – today for the service of your kingdom. You breathed into our nostrils the breath of life that we might live with you, delight in your presence, and enjoy your majestic goodness throughout this creation, most especially in one another. So give us grace today, we pray, not to seek after you with rage because you threaten our control and our kingdoms but rather to seek after you with humility because you are the King who grants us life and fills us with joy. Thank you, Jesus, for coming for us so we can once again experience the wonder of standing before you and one another exposed and yet embraced. Might we live today free from sin and free from shame because we are yours. Amen.

JANUARY 3 (GENESIS 3, MATTHEW 3)

Holy Father, how often I have neglected your Word, doubted your good care for me, and disobeyed your direction for my life. I look at my own heart and acknowledge my selfish desires and preference for my own way in so many areas (*tell God about your own idols and struggles*) ... I look at my own life and confess my willful disobedience both by commission and by omission (*confess to God your own sinful actions*) ... I look at the world around me and grieve the evidence of the Fall and the curse on creation, relationships, and cultures (*ask God to heal the places of brokenness that sadden you today*). Most of all, Father, our rebellion has broken our relationship with you – help us, heal us, restore us! Have mercy on me and in all my unrighteousness, grant to me to be covered in Jesus' righteousness, that I may know today I am still your beloved son, in whom you are well pleased. I plead with you in His holy name, Amen.

JANUARY 4 (GENESIS 4, MATTHEW 4)

Jesus, we come to you as people familiar with the battle against sin and the temptation of Satan. Praise you for your succeeding where we have often failed, for trusting your Father's provision instead of taking things into your own hands, for leaning on the truth of Scripture to combat the lies of Satan. Your faithfulness is our hope, your righteousness our pure garments, your life our life. In the strength of your Spirit, might we repent of our failures, resist the schemes of Satan, and rest in the purity of your righteousness – a righteousness we receive from God only by faith! Today, gracious Father, give us your grace to humble ourselves under your mighty hand, to resist the Devil and watch him flee, to live with and for the Savior who lived and lives for us. We rely not on our strength but on yours in the matchless name of our perfectly obedient Hero and Savior, King Jesus, Amen.

JANUARY 5 (GENESIS 5, MATTHEW 5)

Jesus, in reflecting on your law, we realize the standard is as high as heaven's perfection, wide enough to include all our neighbors and even enemies, and as deep as the thoughts and desires of our hearts. How beautiful your law is to us! And yet how unattainable the standard often feels! Thank you for teaching us the true nature of the law you came to fulfill and at the same time for offering blessing to the poor in spirit. Make us, Holy Spirit, into those children of God who love as we have been loved by extending forgiveness to enemies, who find joy in you by sharing of your goodness with others around us, and who delight in making peace by giving generously of our time and treasure even to the undeserving. May all who see us today and are impacted by the way we treat them give glory to God because you have made us salt and light in Huntsville and beyond. So very amen, we pray.

JANUARY 6 (GENESIS 6, MATTHEW 6)

O God, in a world that ignores your ways and multiplies wickedness – to which we ourselves contribute – have mercy that we might find grace, favor with you, like Noah. So work in our hearts that it may be said of us, as it was of Noah, that we did all that you commanded us to do. We are anxious, Father, worried about (*tell God what weighs on your heart*) – but we remember now that you know what we need and give us our daily bread. We seek first our own kingdoms in so many ways (*tell God about an idol you're seeking*) – but we remember now that your kingdom is more worthy. We lay up for ourselves treasures on earth (*tell God what things of this world attract your heart's affection*) – but we remember now that our Heavenly Father delights to give us good things that last from the abundance of his eternal treasure. So may we trust you and your Word and pray for your help to follow you, in Jesus' name, Amen.

JANUARY 7 (GENESIS 7, MATTHEW 7)

Our Father in Heaven, you are such a good Father – kind and compassionate, faithful and true. You give so many good gifts to your children, well beyond what we deserve. And you invite us to ask you expectantly because of your gracious character – forgive us when we don't think highly enough of you to ask. At the start of this new year, we ask for your glory to be our heart's desire. We ask for your provision for us and our families. We ask for our friends and neighbors who don't know you as their Father to find the stability of building their houses on the rock. We ask for our mission partners to be encouraged by your faithfulness and by new gospel opportunities. We ask for those in our community overwhelmed by life to experience the comfort of your presence by your Spirit. We ask for a renewed passion for time with you every day of this year. And we ask all these things with the confidence that you love to answer. Amen.

JANUARY 8 (GENESIS 8, MATTHEW 8)

God of all creation, thank you that the sun rises again this morning because you are faithful to your covenant promises. You are the One who speaks and brings life to the world, who speaks and calms the storms, who speaks and upholds the creation moment by moment. Because of your great power and steadfast love, we awake and live in a world of beauty and life. Would you please grow in me faith like the centurion – faith that trusts your power more than my own, your plan more than my own, your promises more than my own. I marvel today at the Jesus who heals, who calms, who rules over evil – surely there is no one else like Him! *(Tell God the things about Jesus you most love or find most marvelous!)* I worship you, Jesus. I trust you, Jesus. I place my faith in you, Jesus, and no one else, even as I pray in your beautiful and powerful name, Amen.

JANUARY 9 (GENESIS 9-10, MATTHEW 9)

(Spend a few moments contemplating a rainbow – the beautiful sign of God's beautiful covenant promises that He is no longer at war with the earth.) Glorious and faithful God, for centuries and millennia you have continued to hang your bow in the clouds. Time after time you remind us that we can trust your promises. In the midst of each storm, you assure us that there is hope and life and good news to be shared. You continue to call us to bear your image in every corner of your creation. As you continue to heal, we are agents of your healing. As you continue to teach, we are agents of your truth. As you continue to call people to yourself, we are agents of your gospel call. We pray earnestly, as you command us, to send out workers into your harvest fields – even show us, faithful covenant God, where and to whom you are sending us – that the earth may be filled with the knowledge of you, your beauty, and your faithfulness. Amen.

JANUARY 10 (GENESIS 11, MATTHEW 10)

Merciful Father, forgive us for seeking to make a name for ourselves when you have called us to fill the earth with the glory of your name, for caring more about our fame than yours, for seeking to accomplish things our way rather than yours. You have sent us into the world that we might freely give away the good news of the kingdom of heaven that we have freely received. O make us more generous, sacrificial, and obedient. Do what you must that your people would fulfill your calling on our lives. Humble us, redirect us, even foil our plans for the sake of the earth being filled with your glory. Even, Lord, give us perseverance to endure persecution for the sake of your name – especially our missionaries from Ireland to India, from France to Togo – because you have numbered every hair on our head. So, Good Shepherd, we trust you, we follow you, we declare your glory among the nations – for the sake of Jesus, Amen.

JANUARY 11 (GENESIS 12, MATTHEW 11)

O God of Abraham, who set out to bless his undeserving people for the sake of the nations, indeed give us the rest you offer us today. We are weary and heavy laden from the battle against evil in our hearts (*tell Jesus your specific sin struggles*), from the attacks of the Evil One (*tell Jesus your specific attacks*), from the broken structures of this evil age (*tell Jesus the specific burdens you carry from this world*). Give us rest this Sabbath Day in our bodies, in our minds, especially in our souls. May we lay down our burdens, set down our devices, and put down our sins. In their place may we take up your promises in your Word, hold up our brothers and sisters who are weary, and pick up the comfort of your finished work. Come to us, Holy Spirit, and bless us. Help us come to Jesus today. So teach us to trust Him more that we might not miss the rest He offers us. In his gracious and glorious name we pray, Amen.

JANUARY 12 (GENESIS 13, MATTHEW 12)

What a beautiful Savior you are to us, Lord Jesus! A bruised reed you will not break – O thank you, because we are often weak and wounded, sick and sore; we so desperately need your tender care and healing. A smoldering wick you will not quench – O thank you, because we falter and fade and so desperately need your strength that we might burn with a zeal for you. We place our hope in your name, in your promises, in your strength for today and every day, O promised Messiah, Lion of Judah, Good Shepherd! Show us our weakness that we may see more of your strength. Show us our need that we may see more of your sufficiency. Show us our sin that we may see more of your mercy. We want to know you more, Jesus. We long to experience closeness with you. We desperately need you and are grateful that you are not ashamed to call us your brothers and sisters. We love you! Amen.

JANUARY 13 (GENESIS 14, MATTHEW 13)

Jesus, you indeed are the pearl of great price, the treasure hidden in the field, the One whom to know and have as our own we would gladly sell everything we have. Your kingdom, even though it might appear small to us at times, is the one we would seek first, serve most, and give the best of our lives for. Forgive us, Lord, when we neglect time with you in the midst of our busyness and hurry. Forgive us, Lord, when we chase pleasure, power, or possessions as more valuable than you. Forgive us, Lord, when we choose protecting our own comfort over living for your kingdom. May it be true, King Jesus, that you are more precious to us than gold or silver, that nothing we desire compares to you, that we would leave everything we have to follow you – and that we would find any sacrifice worth it to treasure the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus our Lord. Reset our values, precious Lord. Amen.

JANUARY 14 (GENESIS 15, MATTHEW 14)

O God, my shield, my defender, the One who makes covenant promises to me and keeps them at the cost of his own Son, strengthen my faith today. What could harm me if I am held in your strong hand? Who can stand against me if you sustain me? How could I go without anything I need when you provide all that I need? Strengthen my faith today. What an amazing gift that you credit faith as righteousness even before I've done anything to earn it. You walk through the animals while I sleep because you're more committed to our relationship than I am. Strengthen my faith today. When the winds of trouble blow all around me, when I begin to be afraid, when I begin to lose sight of you because I'm so distracted by my circumstances, fix my gaze afresh on Jesus so that I am certain I am rescued by Him, forgiven by Him, and held by Him today and always. Strengthen my faith today so I live by faith in the Son of God. In his name I pray, Amen.

JANUARY 15 (GENESIS 16, MATTHEW 15)

O God who sees, as you once saw Hagar by the spring of water in the wilderness, see me today. I, too, feel insignificant and forgotten when *(tell God about a situation in your life where you feel no one cares)*. I, too, struggle to feel you are caring for me *(tell God why you struggle to see his provision in your life)*. I, too, feel afraid and uncertain how to go on in my own strength *(tell God how you feel when you seem alone and overwhelmed)*. But you see me. The God who watches over the entire universe sees me. The God who never slumbers nor sleeps sees me. The God who is near the broken-hearted and saves the crushed in spirit sees me. Even when I don't see you, you, Lord, see me. Thank you, thank you, thank you! Remind me that when you see me, you remember me for my good – and so incline and enflame my heart toward you that I would honor you not only with my lips but also with a heart that longs to stay near you. Amen.

JANUARY 16 (GENESIS 17, MATTHEW 16)

Praise be to the God of the covenant, the God whose covenant relationship is with us and our children, the God whose covenant relationship is everlasting! How immediately and eternally hopeful! You hold us, and you hold our children. In fact, you sent your own child to earth and to the cross that we might be yours forever. Keep us clear on the unique identity of Jesus as the promised Messiah, the Son of the living God, the King who gives his life for his subjects rather than demanding they give their lives for Him. Make us willing today to lose our lives for the One who lost his life for us. Show us what the path of the cross looks like in our own lives lest we live for ourselves. Remind us that even if we were to gain the whole world, if our souls were yet distant from Jesus, we would lose. And so, our covenant God, hold us tight and take our lives and let them be consecrated, Lord, to Thee. Amen.

JANUARY 17 (GENESIS 18, MATTHEW 17)

Holy Father, this picture of Abraham interceding for sinful people is a beautiful reminder to us of our great Advocate, Jesus Christ the righteous. Even today He stands before you not merely transfigured for a moment but exalted forever – we rejoice with Bunyan that our righteousness is in heaven! Even today He pleads his blood for our forgiveness so that his Father can remain both just and the One who justifies sinners – we rejoice that we now have peace with God through Jesus Christ! Even today by his Spirit He intercedes for us when we don't know how to pray with groans that words cannot express – we rejoice that we can come with confidence into your throne room even when we don't know what to ask for and don't have words. Show us Jesus more glorious, more gracious, more generous toward us than we ever dared to dream. In his name and for his glory we ask you, Amen.

JANUARY 18 (GENESIS 19, MATTHEW 18)

God who is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, I bring before you today (*tell God about a relationship that is actively difficult for you, one in which you are harboring bitterness or unforgiveness, one that you struggle to desire restoration in or struggle to know how to pursue reconciliation*). As I pray for (*name this person*), I ask you to give me your heart for them. I ask you to help me see them the way you see them. I ask you to give me forgiveness for even the sins they haven't confessed to me. And O Father, when your loving heart is slow to come in me, remind me how much forgiveness you have shown me, how you had to pluck me out of those deserving destruction, how but for your grace I would be continuing to run away from you. So soften my heart. Fill me with your forgiveness. Grant me your peace in this broken relationship for the glory of your gracious name. Amen.

JANUARY 19 (GENESIS 20, MATTHEW 19)

Heavenly Father, we lift before you today the families of our family, church family, and community. Protect and nourish our marriages, God. We are, like Father Abraham, so capable of thinking only of ourselves and treating our spouses carelessly. By your Spirit, help us flee sexual immorality. Guard us against divorce by deepening the bonds of love in our marriage and giving us forgiveness to share in place of resentment and bitterness. Might we put on display for this watching, lonely, and confused world the love that you have for your Church. Grow and mature our children, God. You welcome them to yourself, Jesus, and you bless them. Even now by the work of your Spirit, work in the hearts of the children of Southwood; give them grace to see the wonder of relationship with you; use their teachers and small group leaders to show your love to them from the nursery through to High-Life. Help all our families, Jesus. Amen.

JANUARY 20 (GENESIS 21, MATTHEW 20)

Jesus, the great Physician; Jesus, the One who looks in pity on his hurting people; Jesus, the Healer of all our diseases, help us, we pray. We lift before you this morning those in our church family and community we know battle chronic pain and illness. Give *(include specific names here)* endurance, relief, and faith. In your mercy meet those caring for loved ones who are battling dementia or failing health. Remember and strengthen *(include specific names here)*, O God. Bring healing to those battling everything from cancer to colds *(include specific names here)*, for those awaiting surgery and others recovering from surgery *(include specific names here)*, for those battling addictions, depression, and other mental illness *(include specific names here)*. Thank you, ultimately, for coming to give your life as a ransom for many so that our eternal healing is certain. We love you and look for your healing, Jesus. Amen.

JANUARY 21 (GENESIS 22, MATTHEW 21)

Jesus, I rejoice that you have come as the promised sacrifice, our promised substitute, the promised provision of God for my greatest needs. Thank you for standing in my place and paying it all, that debtors like me may go free forever. Thank you for bearing my sins in your body on the tree so that I might die to sin and live to righteousness. Thank you for becoming sin for me in this great exchange so that I might become the righteousness of God in union with you. What a great Savior I have! Increase my faith, grow my gratitude, enlarge my love for Jesus. When I survey the wondrous cross on which the Prince of Glory died, my richest gain I count but loss and pour contempt on all my pride. May I never boast except in the cross of Jesus. May I take up my cross today and live for his glory. May I live with Him today in the confidence that He will be all that I need. Praise you, my great substitute and my dear friend! Amen.

JANUARY 22 (GENESIS 23, MATTHEW 22)

How amazing it is, Almighty God, that the first and most important thing you require of us is not to do something for you but to live in loving relationship with you! With all we are and all we have we worship you. We declare you are lovely beyond our comprehension – your glory is infinite, your steadfast love is endless, your grace is inexhaustible! You are infinite, eternal, and unchanging in your being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth. And so we seek your help because we have not loved you as we ought but instead focused on other priorities and pursuits. In fact, we have so often loved ourselves more than we love you or the neighbors you made in your image and placed in our paths. Even as you extend your forgiveness again, draw our hearts back to love you more than anyone or anything else. In the matchless name of Jesus we pray, Amen.

JANUARY 23 (GENESIS 24, MATTHEW 23)

O God who pursues our hearts, forgive us for the pharisaical tendencies alive and well in us all. We long too much for the applause of man and position ourselves for honor rather than pointing praise to you. Sometimes we even exalt ourselves at the expense of others; O Lord, humble us that you may lift us up! Forgive us for offering as hope to our neighbors a life lived more like ours rather than a life rescued by Jesus. Forgive us for talking about your heart for the poor but overlooking the cold, hungry, and lonely in our own city. Forgive us for focusing on the appearance of spirituality while neglecting a heart that beats with love for you and delight in your Word. Cleanse us from the inside, out, Holy Spirit, that we may be truly clean. Wash us so that we will be whiter than snow. Restore to us the joy of our salvation – knowing and loving you deeply today and forever! Thank you for pursuing our hearts. Amen.

JANUARY 24 (GENESIS 25, MATTHEW 24)

O Jesus, make me ready and waiting – even longing – for your return! When the burdens and pains of this life seem too much for me to bear (*tell Him what feels like that right now*), help me look forward to my eternal heavenly home you have prepared for me. When I feel alone and abandoned (*tell Him when you recently felt He didn't see your struggle*), remind me that you are coming back for me – that where you are I may also be. When I get so focused on the things of this world that I don't make time for you or prioritize your kingdom (*tell Him what has been distracting your heart's attention and affection most often this week*), lift my eyes to see from your eternal perspective that the things I see are temporary while the unseen things really last. Even today, come, Lord Jesus! Come and deliver us, come and restore us, come and satisfy us with your steadfast love that brought you to this earth the first time. Maranatha! Amen.

JANUARY 25 (GENESIS 26, MATTHEW 25)

O Jesus, how closely you associate yourself with the least, the lost, the littlest, the lonely, and the left-out! You say that in loving them, we love you. You say this is a fundamental evidence of being yours. You say our neglect of loving them is a neglect of loving you. O forgive us, Jesus, for the many times we have neglected to care for you by neglecting to care for those you made in your image and you love so passionately. Thank you that you have extended blessing to us far beyond our deserving because of your gracious promises and faithful character. You indeed have loved us when we were desperate and undeserving. Might we then delight in sharing that same kind of love with many others. Give us your eyes for the broken-hearted; give us your arms for the ones neglected; give us your heart for the ones forgotten. May we use the gifts you have given us to love the ones you created to love. Amen.

JANUARY 26 (GENESIS 27, MATTHEW 26)

Jesus, our great Savior, in the agony and torment of facing the cross, you prayed to your Father, "Not as I will, but as you will. ... Your will be done." We who live united to you by faith would pray that same prayer over and over today. Your will be done, Father. Not what I will but what you will. We pray this for the people we love most (*name people you struggle to trust to God and conclude with Jesus' prayer*) ... We pray this for the situations most important to us (*tell God the places you most want to be in control and have things your way and conclude with Jesus' prayer*). ... We pray this for the plans we are making for the future (*list the ways you would like to see your life go but need to trust to your Heavenly Father and conclude with Jesus' prayer*). Your will is best. You will answer our prayers with what we ask for or with what we would ask for if we knew everything you know. So we trust you, gracious Father. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JANUARY 27 (GENESIS 28, MATTHEW 27)

O God, who dwells in unapproachable light but stoops to dwell with the lowly, come make your home with me right where I am today. As you came near to Jacob in his weakness, sin, struggle, and uncertainty, as you reaffirmed your gracious promises to him when he least deserved them, as you affirmed your presence with him wherever he went, so speak your comfort to my heart today. Thank you especially for making your home with us in the person of Jesus – what a holy incarnation! Thank you that his life here assures us heaven still intends to dwell with the lowly. Thank you for his sacrificial death in our place – even dying for those of us who at times have abandoned, rejected, or neglected Him. May his blood be on us and on our children – to cover us in our shame, to wash away all our sin, to restore life where we deserve death. Thank you for being with us today in every moment and every situation, our ever-present Help. Amen.

JANUARY 28 (GENESIS 29, MATTHEW 28)

Risen Jesus, you are alive – what a marvelous reality! You died but are alive forevermore, never more to die. Now we must no longer be afraid – of Satan, of death, of loneliness, of weakness, of people, of failure. You are with us, you are for us, you are with us! Jesus, as you sent your disciples to make disciples of all nations, so may we pray and labor for everyone we know and everyone around the world to know the risen Savior. As you sent your disciples under your authority, so may we live today not relying on our own strength but depending on the power of your Holy Spirit. As you sent your disciples yet promised to be with them always, so may we trust that we are never alone and that you live to live in us and with us. Your resurrection is our hope, King Jesus, as we look forward to the day we rise with you to live with you, nevermore to die – what a marvelous reality! Fill us with that hope, in our risen Savior's name, Amen.

JANUARY 29 (GENESIS 30, MARK 1)

Merciful God, I am amazed by the people you choose to bless. You bless deceptive tricksters, selfish spouses, distracted disciples, tormented churchgoers, desperate sick people, and disobedient lepers. This amazing grace gives me such great hope because I (*tell God some of the reasons you feel undeserving of his mercy, healing, or affection*). Though everyone else may forget me, you will never forget me. Though my sins earn your wrath, you will forgive me because of Jesus. Though my strength fail me, you will yet sustain me. You love me not because I am lovely but because you are loving. Praise the Lord for this, O my soul! Even today meet me, Lord, and help me as I (*tell God the weaknesses, challenges, and struggles you anticipate already today*). Guide me as I face unexpected difficulties that I may trust your sovereign grace in all things. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

JANUARY 30 (GENESIS 31, MARK 2)

Heavenly Father, who knows what I need even before I ask Him, you have called me to ask, to come boldly before your throne of grace, to acknowledge my dependence upon you. Thank you for meeting my needs even better than I know them! Thank you for healing my heart when I ask merely for my body to be healed. Thank you for seeing through my tough exterior to the sinful, needy heart. Help me, Jesus, great Friend of Sinners, to be the kind of friend who brings other people to you. Even now I bring before you, the God of all comfort, those I know who are grieving (*lift specific people before God*) ... I bring before you, the way, the truth, and the life, those I know who are wandering from you (*lift specific people before God*) ... I bring before you, the God who provides, those I know who are in particular need (*lift specific people before God*). Meet them and me, Jesus, even better than I know to ask. I come needy to you. Amen.

JANUARY 31 (GENESIS 32, MARK 3)

Almighty God, how desperately I need your blessing! I need you to do good to me and my family. I need you to turn your face toward me in loving kindness and grace. Like Jacob as he wrestled with you, I plead for your goodness to fall on me even if it hurts in the process. Praise you, Father, that you delight to give good gifts to your children who ask. From the depths of your being, you are a God who blesses, who gives yourself to your people in everlasting relationship that we will one day enjoy face to face. You pronounce your blessing upon us repeatedly, as you promise to be the One who keeps us, who makes his face shine upon us, who is gracious and gives us peace. O may we live in the light of your face today! May we delight in being in your family, your sons and daughters who love to bear our Father's image and reflect our Father's glory in our Father's world. Through Jesus we ask this, Amen.

ABOUT THE PLAN
