THE BIBLE & PRAYER

Delighting in our relationship with God involves both listening to Him speak and speaking to Him. Reading God's living and active Word to hear Him often prompts our hearts because we are encouraged, challenged, convicted, or awestruck. Part of relationship is then taking the time to marvel, to contemplate, to consider our hearts and lives in light of his Word. These prayers are based off some of the daily Scripture readings and are intended as aides to that end of slowing down to wonder, to confess, to rejoice before the God who promises He hears when we speak to Him—and that even when we don't know the words to say, He intercedes for us—what a gracious Father we have!

JUNE 1 (DEUTERONOMY 5, PSALM 88)

(Psalm 88 is a lament to God – in fact, the only one left unresolved. If the darkness is heavy for you today, let it give you words to start talking with God in your pain. If you don't feel that right now, cry out to God on behalf of someone else you know and love who is deeply discouraged.) God, even praying to you seems like pushing a boulder up a mountainside. Are you even listening? The very things I asked you not to let happen have happened in my life, and I am absolutely shattered. No one else seems to understand; my friends are either ignoring me or stumbling over what to say; I feel like I'm going to remain in this struggle forever. How does your steadfast love help when death seems so final? Are you never going to answer my prayers and give me some hope? Do you really want me to be this miserable? I am coming back to you, O God, because I have no other place to turn. Please help me and give me hope again!

JUNE 2 (DEUTERONOMY 6, PSALM 89)

Holy God, your commandments are good, right, and true. Remind me that they come from a God who loves me, has rescued me, and is taking me to a good and fruitful place. Forgive me for the many ways I love myself and the things of this world more than I love you. May you chase the idols away from my heart and rule there as undisputed King! I long to live in such a way that my children, their children, and everyone else sees how good and glorious you are. So give me grace also to love my neighbor – to respect them, their time, and their possessions from my heart, in my words, and through my actions at all times. There really is life in the way you created me and called me to function. Make me more willing to submit to your will than to insist on my own way. Make me more eager for your law than for my license. Make me a recipient of your blessing who loves to reach out to others in your name. Amen.

JUNE 3 (DEUTERONOMY 7, PSALM 90)

Gracious Father, who keeps his promises, who blesses his people, who is always faithful, what a wonderful gift that you have chosen to enter into relationship with us! You who are the one God from everlasting to everlasting choose to satisfy us with your steadfast love. O may my heart not hunger for any other fix! Nothing else will comfort me when I feel hurt and oppressed. Nothing else can assure me that my loneliness won't last forever. Nothing else can allow me to stand when everyone seems to be against me. But you, glorious Creator, holy Father, gracious Lord, have set your love upon me – me at my worst, me at my least deserving, me at my most broken – so I know your love will never leave me and never end. You love because you are love; it's your very nature; you never change. My heart is satisfied there. Your love is enough. Certainly I will lack nothing because the One who made me and rules me, loves me. Amen.

JUNE 4 (DEUTERONOMY 8, PSALM 91)

Faithful God, I confess how often I forget how good you have been to me. My days are so busy, my mind is so distracted, and my heart is so selfish that I live many days in self-reliance. Forgive me for thinking even for a moment that I have brought myself to this point in life when it is you who has given me breath, guided my path, and graced my life with more goodness than I could ever earn. *(Take a few minutes to remember – perhaps the people or circumstances God used to bring you to know Him, perhaps the ways He has placed invaluable friends or family members into your life, perhaps the jobs or opportunities He has provided for you to use the gifts He also gave to you – remember that it all comes from Him!)* God, I commit afresh to follow no one but you, to trust no other source of life, to hope in no other person to satisfy me. You are faithful. You are good. You are unfailing. Give me the grace to remember again today. Amen.

JUNE 5 (DEUTERONOMY 9, PSALM 92-93)

Good, good Father, I give thanks to you today because it is right – it is good – it is pleasant to you and to my heart that I do so. (Spend a couple minutes considering things for which you should thank God. Consider both spiritual and physical provisions He has made for you.) Help my heart maintain this rhythm morning and night – your steadfast love at the start of my day, your faithfulness at the end of my day. It's your faithful, covenant love that wakes me up, gives me hope, and directs my path. It's your unfailing commitment to your promises to me that allows me to look back as I lay down to sleep and trust your hand directing my steps even when the day hasn't gone according to my plan. You are good and faithful to me not because I'm good (in fact, I've been stubborn again today!) but because you're good. Thank you, Jesus! May my thanks overflow to you day after day – for who you are and what you've done for me. Amen.

JUNE 6 (DEUTERONOMY 10, PSALM 94)

God, I thank you for your Law even when my heart is stubborn, disobedient, and slow to submit. Help me to love you today with all I am and all I have. You have so graciously loved us and shown us what it looks like to live with you as our only God and our idols abandoned to find life in you. Your amazing love has also showed us how to love our neighbors. Help me to reflect your image to the fatherless, the widow, and the sojourner. Don't let me become critical or political in the way I love. Let your Word direct me and your love compel me to obedience, compassion, and mercy. Forgive my stubborn heart. In fact, circumcise my heart – remove my selfishness, my pride, my willful independence. Humble me into eager obedience, sacrificial love, and selfless service. May people experience through me the God who graciously delivers and kindly calls us into relationship with the One who made us. For your glory, Jesus, Amen.

JUNE 7 (DEUTERONOMY 11, PSALM 95-96)

O God who is great and greatly to be praised, whose commandments guide my life, whose glory is to be spread all over the globe, worthy are you of all this and more! Indeed, may your glory be declared among the nations today. May your greatness and grace go forth through our partners in France (*the Sarrans*), Thailand (*Mint*), India (*RIMI*), Ireland (*the Lewises*), Togo (*the Basses*), and throughout Huntsville and the United States. May the hope of Jesus be the hope of Russia and Ukraine, of Iran and Israel. May your people in those conflict-ridden areas be sustained by grace and empowered for mission. May our Thailand team be encouraged as they finish preparations to join the mission of your gospel around the world. And may your glory indeed cover the earth as the waters cover the seas. This is our dream, and this is your promise, so we ask for it in the name of King Jesus, Amen.

JUNE 8 (DEUTERONOMY 12, PSALM 97-98)

It really does make me glad, King Jesus, to rejoice that you are on the throne of heaven and earth. I know you to be a God of righteousness, justice, peace, mercy, grace, and glory. As much as I like to be in control, I confess that it really is better when you are. You see the end from the beginning; you care for the downtrodden and don't overlook a single one; you are full of steadfast love and faithfulness, so nothing ever slips your mind or falls through the cracks. Praise your holy name! *(Take a minute to sing a song of praise to God – even if all you can make is a joyful noise – perhaps the Doxology, Praise to the Lord the Almighty, or Psalm 150).* Help me today, Father, to live with the same joy with which I sing. May my life demonstrate a focus on your glory, a confidence in your sovereign rule, and a delight in your kind care in my life no matter what comes. I praise you in Jesus' name, Amen.

JUNE 9 (DEUTERONOMY 13-14, PSALM 99-101)

What a privilege it is, God, to sit in your presence today and know that you are God. You alone rule over everything and sustain everything by your powerful word. So I come before you with open hands, palms up, to receive whatever you have for me in faith that it will ultimately be for my good. After all, you made me, and I am yours. Who could ever love me like you do? How could I even know what's best for myself the way you know what's best for me? Thank you, great God, that you are also my good Shepherd. Help me trust that today you will lead me – even right now – in green pastures for my soul to feed, beside still waters for my heart to rest. How good it is to be one of yours! I run eagerly into your presence with the confidence that you will never turn me away, with the joy that you delight to hear what's on my heart, and with the sure hope that I will live with you forever. O I know that you are God. Praise your name!

JUNE 10 (DEUTERONOMY 15, PSALM 102)

Great Creator God, thank you for setting for us the pattern of productive work and restorative rest. What a blessing that is to our souls each week, and how our bodies benefit from it as well! That reminds me to pray for Pastor Derrick as he is on a sabbatical this summer. Father, please bless him and his family with deep delight in you, with rich joy together, with full rest for their souls that you promise to provide. Encourage his heart to trust you with the work of our church and the management of the world. Give him grace to live during this season and always with palms up, eager to trust you and receive what you have for him. Strengthen his passion for your kingdom and the spreading of the good news of Jesus to every neighbor and nation. God, bless this sabbatical season and bless us that our hearts as well would find our rest in you, your gracious character, and your life-giving promises. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JUNE 11 (DEUTERONOMY 16, PSALM 103)

Gracious God, how could I possibly recount all the ways in which you have shown kindness to me? Even in stopping to think now, I realize how many I am likely unaware of entirely! If I were to count the ones I've realized, they would exceed my finite ability to calculate. *(Spend a few minutes listing some of God's many "benefits" to you – write them down if you can – and use Psalm 103 as a guide if you need help.)* God, I'm amazed when I consider that you care for me personally, spiritually, physically, relationally, emotionally, and communally. I can't even keep up with all those areas in my own life, yet you provide for me and for all your other children – praise your infinite greatness! Help me live today full of wonder at your generosity and gratitude for your grace. You are indeed abounding in steadfast love, and I am the grateful beneficiary of the overflow of your grace. Thank you, Father! Amen.

JUNE 12 (DEUTERONOMY 17, PSALM 104)

Lord God, Creator of the ends of the earth, whose glory extends from shore to shore and from everlasting to everlasting, how great you are! You have shown us your glory in your marvelous creation, and then you have given us further understanding of your divine majesty in your Word. I pray today that, as you designed for the kings of old, the leaders of your people today would know, love, and follow your Word. I pray their hearts would be drawn to it, their lives would be directed by it, and their leadership would be shaped by it that they might shepherd all of us the way our Good Shepherd sees fit, in the path of righteousness. May they teach it faithfully, but O God, may they follow it passionately for the glory of your name and the good of your people! Make me, my God and King, increasingly eager to be led by your Spirit in the ways of your Word rather than by my spirit in the ways of this world. For Jesus' sake, I pray. Amen.

JUNE 13 (DEUTERONOMY 18, PSALM 105)

God, you have been faithful day after day and generation after generation. You have even sent the prophet greater than Moses that when we listen to Jesus, we might have life – thank you! What a wonderful reminder to “seek the Lord and his strength; seek his presence continually”! I do that now, Father. I need to be still in your presence; I confess my weakness on my own; I depend again today on your strength. Come and fill me with your Spirit that I might live today on your agenda, not mine; in your strength, not mine; for your glory, not mine. I need you – every hour I need you, so I come to you now. I sit and wait in your gracious presence, overwhelmed that I am welcomed here again by the blood of Jesus. Thank you that I don’t have to seek your presence like a hidden treasure but that you have come near to me and welcomed me home in the person of Jesus once and for all. You are with me; I am at rest. Thank you!

JUNE 14 (DEUTERONOMY 19, PSALM 106)

God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, of Naomi, Daniel, and Jonah, of so many others through the centuries, you alone are worthy of praise! We live the same pattern your people have lived for generations: relationship with you, neglect of you and pursuit of idols, experiencing the consequences of sin, and experiencing the wonders of your redemption, salvation, and grace. We love to tell that story, Father, because we rejoice in your forgiveness and are eager to share of your faithfulness! So help us as we share it with the kids at VBS this week – what a joy and privilege! I do pray, God, teach all of us from our forefathers and from our own lives not to rebel against you anymore, not to look for life in empty things, not to reject the One who accepts us. But O God, when we do, soften our hearts quickly, astonish us again with your steadfast love, renew us as your people eager to do your will. In the name of Jesus the Redeemer, Amen.

JUNE 15 (DEUTERONOMY 20, PSALM 107)

Wisdom is in considering your steadfast love, O God! I do that even now: How faithful you are to your promises! How merciful you are to sinners! How loving you are to people made in your image who have yet marred your image! How gracious you are to the undeserving! How generous you have been to those of us so deeply in need! How long you have maintained your glorious character without changing or failing a single one of us! *(Take a few minutes to contemplate God's steadfast love in your own life. Where has He met you personally? Where would you be without Him?)* God, I thank you today for your steadfast love. May I continue in a spirit of gratitude moment by moment. May I share this thanksgiving publicly as you give me opportunity. May I grow in my gratefulness for who you are and how steadfastly you have loved me – “never stopping, never giving up, unbreaking, always, and forever.” Thank you!

JUNE 16 (DEUTERONOMY 21, PSALM 108-109)

Great and awesome God, indeed your faithfulness reaches to the clouds! What a beautiful image – that it covers the earth, that it goes far beyond where my eyes can see, that nothing is outside your control or the reach of your sovereign faithfulness – what great comfort that gives my heart! Give me eyes of faith then, Father, to trust you when I don't see you – even when I can't trace your hand, to trust your heart. Might I fix my eyes today not on the temporary, seen things but on the eternal, unseen realities. "Great is your faithfulness, O God my Father. There is no shadow of turning with Thee. Thou changest not; thy compassions they fail not; as Thou hast been, Thou forever wilt be. Morning by morning new mercies I see. All I have needed thy hand hath provided. Great is thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me." With joy, confidence, and security, I walk today in your ways; my life is in your hands, O faithful Father! Amen.

JUNE 17 (DEUTERONOMY 22, PSALM 110-111)

(Spend a couple minutes contemplating the statement “the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.” What does it mean to have an appropriate fear of God even as his child who has been invited to draw near to Him always? How does your relationship with God direct your path in wisdom today when starting from your own ideas or worldly wisdom would lead you astray?) God, nothing and no one shapes my day today more than you. You have redeemed me; you have adopted me; you have blessed me; you have provided for me; you have promised to be with me; you have empowered me by your Spirit. Don't let me live one moment today forgetful of your presence, your promises, and your power. Help me to trust your Word above all other counsel. In fact, Father, help me actually to follow your Word in every decision and interaction today. I don't run from you in fear, but I draw near to you in fear – don't ever leave me! Amen.

JUNE 18 (DEUTERONOMY 23, PSALM 112-113)

From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised! So I do that now, Father, joining my heart and lips with all your people and the hosts gathered around your throne to give you thanks, praise, and glory. It is your glory and grace that causes me to care for my neighbor and the nations – loving them even as you have loved me. Give me your generous heart that is eager to share with others, loves seeing the poor and needy provided for, and gladly welcomes in those who otherwise deserve to be kept away. Gracious God, continue to pour your grace into my life every moment I breathe it in; never do I take a breath on my own or by my own merit. Then so help me to breathe out your grace in every relationship seeing your image, in every endeavor sensing your calling, in every moment feeling your presence. I'm your child, Lord God, so help me live with and like my Father today. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JUNE 19 (DEUTERONOMY 24, PSALM 114-115)

Great God and King, I confess what a glory hog I so naturally am. I think much more about how people view me than how they view you. I fight to get credit and recognition more than I trust that you see everything. I worry I will be overlooked or belittled when you promise me I've been made with great significance and purpose. Forgive me, O God who alone is worthy of all glory and honor and praise. To your name be the glory because of your steadfast love and faithfulness. May those I interact with today hear in my words and see in my actions how worthy you are. May my heart find rest and delight in seeing your greatness exalted and your sovereignty trusted by more and more people. May I and all my brothers and sisters seek the glory of your name from this time forth and forevermore. Make me "content to fill a little space if Thou be glorified." In the glorious name of King Jesus, Amen.

JUNE 20 (DEUTERONOMY 25, PSALM 116)

Honest confession, God – many days it feels like living for myself would be better than living for you; following my own desires and agendas seem more helpful than yours; I know better what's best for me. So often I look around and it seems the dishonest guy gets the promotion, the bad guys get the attention of the girls, the immoral girls attract the guys, the prideful and self-promoting end up in positions of power, the cheaters get ahead, the disengaged parents get the respectful kids. O Father, don't let me forget how good and faithful you are to me, how I can trust you for this life and the life to come, how you know best even when I can't see it. Give me your eternal perspective that fortifies my soul against the passing fancies of this life. Help me delight in you more than all the riches and relationships this world offers. Remind me that indeed it is good for me to be near you. You made me for yourself, O God. Thank you.

JUNE 21 (DEUTERONOMY 26, PSALM 117-118)

God, as I consider bringing my tithe to you today, I do so cheerfully – in fact, with great joy – because I’m reminded that you are the One who has led me out of bondage to sin, you are the One who has provided for me all that I have, you are the One who has given me eternal security. All-sufficient God, may even my giving today help my heart rest and help my hands loosen their grip on the things of this world, help my mind remember that everything I have is from you. I want to be a faithful steward, God, of all that you have entrusted to me – job, family, time. So help me steward my time for you and your kingdom work; help me steward my talents to honor you in any way I can; help me steward my finances to extend your kingdom rather than my own. And every time I give, may I rejoice afresh in how generously and extravagantly you have given to me – even at the cost of your own Son! Thank you for Jesus. In his name, Amen.

JUNE 22 (DEUTERONOMY 27, 28:1-19, PSALM 119:1-24)

God of truth and goodness, open my eyes again today as I read your perfect Word that I may behold wonderful things out of your law. Give me a love and longing for your truth that causes me to doubt worldly wisdom and even my own instincts when they don't follow the priorities of your Word. Help me to be not merely a hearer of your Word but increasingly a doer – one who actually obeys in word and in deed. I believe that blessing will flow to me as I walk in your ways, yet I still find myself wandering time and again. Forgive me for the sake of Jesus, who took upon Himself on that cursed tree all the curse due to me for my sin, my disobedience, my willful self-reliance. O Father, make your testimonies my delight and my counselors that I may flourish in the ways that you made me to live. Slow my heart down even now to consider, meditate upon, and apply to my life the Word of life that you have given me. Thank you for it. Amen.

JUNE 23 (DEUTERONOMY 28:20-68, PSALM 119:25-48)

(Take a few minutes to reflect on what it means for God to “enlarge” your heart. In what area do you most long to see your heart enlarged? What would it look like in your relationship with Him? What would it look like in your relationships with other people? Talk to God about your longing for his work in your heart.) God, all too often my heart is “two sizes too small,” as I care much more for my own plans and pleasures than obeying you and serving others. Holy Spirit, who dwells in my heart, stretch the bounds of your presence and power, grow the borders of my love, deepen the sincerity of my compassion. Help me love those my Heavenly Father loves – especially the least, the lost, the littlest, the lonely, and the left-out. Make room when I think I’m full of people to love. Create space for those others struggle to love. Above all else, enlarge my affection for the greatest love I know – love for you, your Word, and your kingdom. Amen.

JUNE 24 (DEUTERONOMY 29, PSALM 119:49-72)

Holy Father, you are worthy of all praise, honor, and glory. You have redeemed my life from the pit, given me a firm place to stand, and shown me the path of life. Thank you! Yet there are those “secret things,” so much that I honestly don’t understand, so many things that happen in my life and this world that don’t seem like what you would want. *(Take a few minutes to talk to God about the situations where you can’t seem to grasp how He could allow them to happen or how He could work them for good in any ultimate way.)* Yet, our Father, what you have revealed to us personally in your Word really is enough for us to trust and obey you. We know you are full of steadfast love, completely sovereign, absolutely good – and specifically loving to us, your people. So help me to rest not in my knowledge, control, or understanding but in you. Thanks for hearing my honest complaints and confusion. I worship you in Jesus’ name, Amen.

JUNE 25 (DEUTERONOMY 30, PSALM 119:73-96)

Gracious Father, what hope would there be for any of us without your kindness that leads us to repentance? Though we have earned the curses for wandering away from you time and again, you welcome us back with the promise of forgiveness and the hope for renewed relationship with you. Hear my prayer for mercy now (*reflect on ways in which your heart is presently wandering away from God and his priorities into inward or outward sin ... tell God honestly what you see*). Create in me a clean heart, O God. May this be more than a moment of sorrow but truly a transformative repentance by the power of your Spirit who dwells in me. I have been far from you and haven't been eager to run home, but I am now. Thank you for the promise to gather me back to yourself no matter how far away I have been scattered. In Jesus, the reach of your mercy knows no limits – praise be to your name! Amen.

JUNE 26 (DEUTERONOMY 31, PSALM 119:97-120)

O God of truth, how I love your Word that guides me day by day, a lamp to my feet and a light to my path! Because you have given us your Law and the story of your gracious covenant, we don't rely on any human leader to know you and follow you. Moses can pass the mantle to Joshua, and your people yet continue to walk in your ways because we can read your very words and meditate on them day and night. Help me, Father, to hear you speaking to me when I wake, as I work, while I eat, as I talk with others, when I relax at night, and as I lay my head to rest. Help me to love your Word even more, to submit to its truth, to hide it in my heart, to treasure its wisdom, and to obey its commands. I so love your goodness and perfection, so make me holy as you are holy. Cleanse me by the washing with water through the Word of truth that I may be yours through and through. In Jesus' holy name, Amen.

JUNE 27 (DEUTERONOMY 32, PSALM 119:121-144)

Father, as Moses told your people, your Word is no empty word but our very life. We depend upon you and your guidance as those who cannot see clearly on our own. We grieve when we or others disregard your law and structure their lives, their relationships, their societies, and more according to their own wisdom. *(Consider the sin in your own life, the broken systems in our own community, and the faulty priorities in our own nation. How do these cause you to ache for God's truth to be loved and followed? Tell God about the burdens He places on your heart.)* O holy Father, renew us personally and corporately – bring repentance and reformation for the sake of your name. Bring to our church a fresh zeal for your Word and never let it wane. Bring to our city and country a renewed longing for your leadership rather than our own self-rule. Bring to our world a new season of peace and shalom from your truth. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JUNE 28 (DEUTERONOMY 33-34, PSALM 119:145-176)

(Take a few minutes to contemplate that “the eternal God is your dwelling place, and underneath are the everlasting arms.” Tell God where you need Him to hold you and confess how you’ve been trying to sustain yourself. Thank God for allowing you always to make your home with Him because Jesus has brought you near.)

God, here I am back in my refuge, my dwelling place, where I long to live. I have fallen again this week, but I’ve not fallen beyond your reach; your arms have caught me and held me once again. Praise you for always riding to the rescue! What stability there is in making my home with the eternal God – who was and who is and who is to come – who will always understand, always see, and always love. Would you sustain those I love who are falling today. Catch them, kind Father. Hold them. Assure them of your unfailing love. Thank you, Jesus, for bringing the everlasting arms to grasp hold of me!

JUNE 29 (JOSHUA 1, PSALM 120-122)

What a joy it was to go to your house yesterday, O Lord! How I delight to sing your praises, to be encouraged by your people, to feed on your Word! May I live today and this week assured by the promise of your presence with me and eager for others to know the wonder of relationship with you. In fact, might your Word, your promise, and your presence make me, like Joshua, strong and courageous. You are the same God who helped Moses lead your people out of Egypt, who strengthened Joshua to lead them into the Promised Land, and who now dwells in me by his Holy Spirit to go with me into the world, wherever I go today. I need help today, mighty and gracious God. I look to no one but you – lifting my eyes to the hills for my help, remembering the worship of your people, clinging to the promises of your Word – therein will I find the strength I need. I'm not alone; no, the God of hosts is with me and for me. Thank you!

JUNE 30 (JOSHUA 2, PSALM 123-125)

God, so often I feel shaken and unstable – by what's inside my own heart and head, by what's swirling around me and sometimes attacking me. *(Tell God what has been shaking you recently, what has made you feel anxious, afraid, or attacked. Even confess how you have tried to find stability on your own.)* Now, Father, I stay with you because you promise that as I'm trusting you, I cannot be moved. I remember the promise that your kingdom, represented by Mount Zion, is the one that cannot be shaken. You have given me that kingdom. You have shown me mercy. You have given your very Son for me that I might know true life with you. Thank you! I don't deserve kindness from you, but you continue to open your hand and give me grace upon grace. You promise that you surround your people, and what a comfort that is to me today. I won't spend one moment of this day apart from you. No matter what happens, I shall not be moved!
