These prayers are based off some of the daily Scripture readings and are intended as aides to that end of slowing down to wonder, to confess, to rejoice before the God who promises He hears when we speak to Him—and that even when we don't know the words to say, He intercedes for us—what a gracious Father we have!

## **MAY 1 (NUMBERS 8, PSALM 44)**

Faithful God, you have been so good to your people – delivering us from sin and death through the gift of your Son, providing us an eternal security through your precious promises, empowering and guiding us day by day through your indwelling Holy Spirit. Thank you! We are eternally grateful! And yet, God, it often seems the enemies of your people have the upper hand on us – maligning us in the public square for holding to the truth of your Word, mocking our “old-fashioned” morality that is even cast as being hateful to dear neighbors you call us to love, convincing our young people that they are missing out on the real life to be found in this world. O God, help! O God, defend us! O God, deliver us! Don’t let us give in to the promise of wealth, fame, and pleasure in this world. Help us cling to the God of steadfast love, who clings to us no matter what. We trust you, and we plead for your help in Jesus’ name, Amen.

## **MAY 2 (NUMBERS 9, PSALM 45)**

Holy Spirit who dwells in me to point me to my Father and guide my every step, help me to listen to you and follow your direction every moment of this day. I have many plans, a schedule to keep, an agenda to accomplish ... but I don't want to go anywhere or do anything except at the command of the Lord. He is the One who has delivered me from slavery to sin. He is the One who provides my daily bread. He is the One who strengthens me in my weakness. So help me to obey all his commands, to follow no other guide, to trust no other wisdom than his. Father, today I commit to you my plans; today I ask for your blessing on all the interactions I will have with other people in your image – the ones I already know of and the ones I don't; today I plead for an awareness of your presence with me to assure me of your love and to guide my path in the way of peace. You alone know what I most need. I trust you! Amen.

## **MAY 3 (NUMBERS 10, PSALM 46-47)**

A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing! You alone are my refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble – how many troubles I face even today – my sinful flesh, the griefs of those I love, the wars that rage around the world, the injustice I feel helpless against, the pains my body carries, the anxieties and temptations that torment my soul. *(Take a few minutes to tell God about the things weighing on your mind and heart, whatever He brings to your mind.)* Now, God, I can be still. I can be silent. I can stop trying to control my world and trust the One who knows my hurts and holds the whole world in his hands. *(Spend a few minutes in complete silence and stillness. Listen to God. Remind yourself when you feel awkward that He is God, that He is with you, and that He is your fortress.)* Praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, the true and living God. May your name be exalted in me and beyond me today. Amen.

## **MAY 4 (NUMBERS 11, PSALM 48)**

Gracious Father, forgive me when I complain, when I decide I know better than you what I most need, when eternal salvation and a relationship with you today seems not enough for me. How foolish, self-focused, and ungrateful I can be! Even the difficulties and struggles of my life in this world are opportunities to bring my needs to you, to receive your healing, to trust your sovereign care for me. Don't let me miss these opportunities! *(Tell God the things in your life that are so frustrating you've been allowing them to distance you from Him rather than bringing them to Him in prayer.)* You have given me your Son. You have given me your Word. You have given me your people – among them, elders to demonstrate your personal care for me and each one of your precious sheep. You have given me your joy. You have given me your love. You have given me your hope – that I might be secure, satisfied in you always. Make me so today. Amen.

## **MAY 5 (NUMBERS 12-13, PSALM 49)**

Faithful Father, I confess this morning that comparing myself to those around me so often steals the joy I have in you from my heart. Sometimes I'm afraid that if I don't have what they have, I'm not safe, secure, or important. Other times I'm really discouraged about myself, disappointed that I couldn't become more like what I wanted to be. Sometimes I'm just jealous that other people have things that I want. I get so focused, Father, on the things of this world that I forget the riches I have in relationship with you, in Christ in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Help me see today with the eyes of eternity. Help me trust the God who has always provided what I really need even when I don't realize it in the moment. Help me walk with the God who promises never to leave or forsake me, including when I enjoy the imperishable inheritance He has for me forever. Forgive me and focus me, Jesus. Amen.

## **MAY 6 (NUMBERS 14, PSALM 50)**

Merciful God, forgive your people when we fearfully fail to trust your promises, when we selfishly prefer our own ways to your commands, when we stubbornly choose a return to Egypt over life full of your abundant provision in the Promised Land. We, like your people Israel, can be so cautious about taking a step of faith when you've promised us the gates of Hell will not withstand your Church. We, like your people Israel, get distracted from faithfully following you by all the seemingly good things around us that we need to keep us safe. We, like your people Israel, sometimes prefer our own sin because it's comfortable and known to us than a life of freedom and faith where you bless us beyond what we could ask or imagine. *(Tell God where you see these sinful tendencies in our church and Christians more broadly in our day).* Forgive us, revive our hearts, renew your Church, all for the glory of Jesus. Amen.

## **MAY 7 (NUMBERS 15, PSALM 51)**

O God, reading David's confession is so humbling because the weight of my sin and failure hits me afresh. My careless words, wrongful thoughts, and selfish deeds are first and foremost against you and your holy name. How could I bow to any other God? My heart is wicked and deceptive, and time and again I wander. Yet it's my heart you seem to care about so much and want to renovate and long to have return to you. After all the detail you gave for these Old Testament sacrifices, the thing you're really after is my heart. You long for relationship with me at the deepest level of who you made me to be. You want not merely a tweaked behavior but transformed affections. You are working in me not to use me but to restore me that I might know you and the true joy of my salvation in relationship with you! O Holy Spirit, above all else work in me that clean, broken, and contrite heart in which God delights. For Jesus' sake, Amen.

## **MAY 8 (NUMBERS 16, PSALM 52-54)**

Faithful, covenant-keeping God, I will sing and think and speak of your steadfast love now and all the day! When I think only of my sin, I am overwhelmed – there is no part of me that relates to you the way that I should. When I consider my capacity for rebellion and self-promotion, I am humbled – I'm as capable as Korah of pushing myself forward and neglecting to trust God. When I dwell on your holy justice and hatred for sin, I am driven to my knees – I'm so deserving of your punishment if left to my own devices. So, Father, I will trust in your steadfast love forever and ever. I will trust that although my sins are like scarlet, you make them white as snow. I will trust that you are more loving toward me than I can imagine. I will trust that your love for me is based not on my being lovely but on your being loving. So today may every gift and every struggle drive me back to your steadfast love. Praise you, Jesus! Amen.

## **MAY 9 (NUMBERS 17-18, PSALM 55)**

Great God and King, you invite me to cast my burden on you and find that you will sustain me. So I do that now ... *(Tell God what weighs heavy on your heart for yourself personally – sin, struggle, health; what weighs heavy on your heart for others – your kids, your neighbors, your friends; what weighs heavy on your heart for the world around you – our nation, wars and injustice, persecution and martyrdom.)* What a comfort, Father, that you hear your child's cries no matter when we bring them to you! What a comfort, King Jesus, that you rule over the nations and every situation that burdens me! What a comfort, tender Spirit, that you know how to sustain me in the darkest moments and at my weakest times! O how I need your sustaining grace again today! Thank you that its fullness is more than enough to meet my ever-increasing need. I draw near and cry out to you in Jesus' name, Amen.

## **MAY 10 (NUMBERS 19, PSALM 56-57)**

In our weakness, Heavenly Father, there is much for us to fear – spiritual attack, personal failure, emotional pain, and much more (*tell God what some of your specific fears are right now*). But as I turn to place my trust in you again, I find that you don't belittle my concerns. My fears and my tears are precious to you; in fact, you collect them in a bottle and write them in your book! You, the One who will one day wipe them all away, yet value them today as I so need. You are so worthy of my trust, Father, that not a hair falls from my head apart from you, that you hear my cries even when I'm in the depths, that even in death you are strong enough to protect my life so that even when I die I will live. Thank you that you have delivered me from all these fears being ultimate or all these tears being permanent! Give me the strength of your Spirit to trust you again today in my most fearful places. Amen.

## **MAY 11 (NUMBERS 20, PSALM 58-59)**

God, it is sobering to me that Miriam (*who led your people in praise after the Red Sea deliverance*), Moses (*who was your appointed prophet who spoke personally with you*), and Aaron (*who was your chosen priest to represent your people and lead them to you*) all died before reaching the Promised Land to which you had them leading your people. How my weakness gnaws at my heart! Like Moses, even in my greatest moments of leadership and service of God, I am tempted to trust myself, to do things my own way, or to take glory for myself. Truly, who can deliver me from this body of death? Praise Jesus that there is a greater Savior, a greater Priest, and a greater Promised Land where He is taking even those of us who fail or fall along the way! Give me the humility needed for someone of my weakness and the courage needed for someone with your strength at work in him. In Jesus' name I ask. Amen.

## **MAY 12 (NUMBERS 21, PSALM 60-61)**

Jesus, today I contemplate the serpent in the wilderness – where in desperation the people cried out for help and looked for salvation to that which was killing them – and I praise you for being lifted up for me, for becoming sin for me even though you knew no sin, for allowing me to look at what was killing me and find salvation, deliverance, healing, and hope. Precious Savior, how amazing that you so full of blessing would become a curse for me! How humbling that you so near to the Father would be sent away that I might be welcomed in! How awe-inspiring that you who needed no saving would give your life to save a wretch like me! Indeed, hear my cry, O God, and lead me to the Rock that is higher than I. No one else could save like you, Jesus. No other refuge offers safety like you, Jesus. No one else is lifted up on a cross to draw people to Himself forever. Praise your gracious and awesome name! Amen.

## **MAY 13 (NUMBERS 22, PSALM 62-63)**

Almighty God of power, gracious God of steadfast love, who is like you? Thank you for being both strong and tender, both mighty and merciful, both transcendent above and heavens and immanent in my life. I ponder today your steadfast love. (*Consider for a few minutes what God's steadfast love is – covenantal, faithful, passionate, pursuing, personal, unending ... what has it looked like in your story?*) Indeed, Father, your steadfast love is better than life! I'd rather have your love than all the riches in the world because you are the best thing. I'd rather trust your love than control my own future because you know better than I do what I need. I'd rather share your love than be the most famous and respected teacher the world has ever known because nothing is better than relationship with you today and forever. Help me know you more, Father. Keep me in your steadfast love that never lets me go. Amen.

## **MAY 14 (NUMBERS 23, PSALM 64-65)**

O You who hears prayers, what a wonderful way to describe you, my God and King. You always hear – it's who you are. You heard Jonah in the belly of the whale. You heard King Jehoshaphat when he was outnumbered and overwhelmed. You heard Daniel in a godless nation before a prideful king and a den of lions. You heard Jesus in the garden before the cross. You heard your people gathered when Peter was in prison. You have heard me time and again, and you will always hear my cries. What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer – to talk to you about anything on my heart, to listen to you redirect my heart after your will, to sit with you and marvel at your goodness and grace! Praise you for being a God who hears. Where would I have been so many times if you didn't hear me? What would my hope be if you stopped hearing and answering? Thank you for being a God who invites me into his throne room and hears. Amen.

## **MAY 15 (NUMBERS 24, PSALM 66-67)**

For the way you bless your people, O God, thank you! The words of that benediction ring in my ears even on a Friday – bless us, keep us, make your face shine upon us! What a wonder that you would still be blessing us. Certainly you blessed us after creating us “very good” in the Garden of Eden. Certainly you blessed us as the crown of your creation in your image to rule over the rest of what you had made. But now – after our rebellion, after we distorted your image, after we’ve run after idols time and again to our own harm – now you bless us again. Now you have sent Jesus to us to pronounce your persistent and permanent blessing upon all who come to you through Him. Now you give us living hope, the presence of your Spirit in us, the certainty of your smiling face, the outpouring of your grace, the building of your Church, and so much more! Indeed, you are a God who blesses us. Praise you! Amen.

## **MAY 16 (NUMBERS 25, PSALM 68)**

Holy and righteous King, psalm after psalm cries for you to deliver us from your and our enemies. Father, forgive me when I make anyone different or disagreeing with me into my enemy. But when people stand against you and your name, when my sinful flesh rises up within me to drag me away from you, when Satan attacks me with all his lies and temptations to offer me something better than you, please deliver me from all these enemies! O God, you know that on my own I am not strong enough to withstand the evil against me, but you also know that I am not alone – that greater is He that is in me than he that is in the world. So rescue me, O God of my salvation, God who always delivers his people, God who hears the cry of the lowly and oppressed, and vindicate me before any who would condemn me or belittle the glory of your name. Deliver me for the glory of your name and the good of my relationship with you. Amen.

## **MAY 17 (NUMBERS 26, PSALM 69)**

*(Spend a couple minutes contemplating the statement “zeal for your house consumes me.” In what ways do you share the passion of David – and later of Jesus – for God’s worship, God’s glory, God’s people? How has your distraction with the world or frustration with the Church caused your zeal for God’s “house” to wane?)* God, you are great and greatly to be praised, worthy of all my moments and all my days. Forgive me for the ways in which I am more zealous for my own name than yours, my own comfort than your kingdom, my own agenda than your will. Increase in me the heart of David and Jesus to be zealous for your house – to worship you with all my life, to defend your glory against all rivals, to protect your people in every nation. Take my life and let it be consecrated, Lord, to thee. Root out of my heart anything that competes with you that I may be wholeheartedly yours. For Jesus’ sake I pray, Amen.

## **MAY 18 (NUMBERS 27, PSALM 70-71)**

Faithful Father, I pray for the leaders of your people today. I pray for our church's pastors, elders, deacons, Grace Group leaders, teachers, and ministry team members. How vital it is that leaders not be ultimate but that leaders faithfully point us all to trust and follow you alone! So I pray for you to raise up new leaders among us – even another generation like Joshua who would know you, love your Word, and lead your people like Moses, not perfectly but faithfully. Give them grace to deepen their walk with you and grow their confidence in your goodness. Be with them even in their older age that they would proclaim your glory and grace to the next generation, as they point all of us coming behind them to trust in your power. Bless them with endurance to finish the race with faith in you rather than faltering in their own strength. Thank you for the gift of godly leaders. Please continue to bless and build your church in this way! Amen.

## **MAY 19 (NUMBERS 28, PSALM 72)**

○ King Jesus, I bow before you and praise you for ruling with justice and righteousness, mercy and peace, grace and truth. May your “kingdom stretch from shore to shore, ‘til moons shall wax and wane no more!” Likewise, may those who lead your people reflect your glorious rule in the way they lead us to care for the poor consistently, love our neighbors sacrificially, and pity the weak and needy passionately. May their leadership cause your kingdom to expand, King Jesus, and your Church to be built and perfected as your wonderful bride. Finally, ○ mighty and kind King, would you please give us more civil leaders who reflect these virtues. In our city, our country, and our world, would you raise up leaders committed to justice, mercy, and peace; leaders more concerned about your honor than their own; leaders focused on your justice and righteousness. As we long for such leaders, turn our hearts afresh to King Jesus! Amen.

## **MAY 20 (NUMBERS 29, PSALM 73)**

Honest confession, God – many days it feels like living for myself would be better than living for you; following my own desires and agendas seem more helpful than yours; I know better what's best for me. So often I look around and it seems the dishonest guy gets the promotion, the bad guys get the attention of the girls, the immoral girls attract the guys, the prideful and self-promoting end up in positions of power, the cheaters get ahead, the disengaged parents get the respectful kids. O Father, don't let me forget how good and faithful you are to me, how I can trust you for this life and the life to come, how you know best even when I can't see it. Give me your eternal perspective that fortifies my soul against the passing fancies of this life. Help me delight in you more than all the riches and relationships this world offers. Remind me that indeed it is good for me to be near you. You made me for yourself, O God. Thank you.

## **MAY 21 (NUMBERS 30, PSALM 74)**

How great and awesome you are, O God, to own the day and the night, to maintain the boundaries of the earth and sustain its life, to invent and control seasons and weather and nature and people. Praise your mighty name! And it is that greatness, Father, that makes me long for you to establish your kingdom and finally rid your world of all your enemies who set themselves against you, your people, and your creation. I bristle when I hear your name used dismissively or vainly. I groan when I hear of your people being persecuted and martyred in Nigeria and elsewhere around the world. I cry out for your name to be made great in every heart when I see so many wandering aimlessly and harming so many others. O God, arise and make your name known from shore to shore – that your glory would fill our hearts and your grace shape our cultures and societies. Come quickly, Lord Jesus. Amen.

## **MAY 22 (NUMBERS 31, PSALM 75-76)**

Holy God, there is none like you, and all who set themselves up against you will come to naught. No leader no matter how powerful, no influencer no matter how boastful, no evildoer no matter how conniving can stand against your perfect justice. We long, Judge of all the earth, to see you set everything right, to make justice flow like a river, to make all the bad things in our lives come untrue and be gone forever. Give us patience and perseverance as we wait in the midst of an unjust, arrogant, self-promoting world that dares to set itself up against you as a rival source of freedom, glory, and life. Pour your wrath out on all such unrepentant attackers of your name and your image in this world. And Father, thank you for sending Jesus to take your wrath in our place. Without his sacrifice, we too would have to drink the cup of your just vengeance on our sin to its dregs. Thank you that He has done it for us and lives to give us life. Praise Him! Amen.

## **MAY 23 (NUMBERS 32, PSALM 77)**

*(Take a few minutes to consider what things in your life or in the world around you make you grieve or cry out to God. Where does it feel like God doesn't see or isn't helping?)* God, I cry out to you today because I know you will hear me; I trust in your steadfast love; I know you tell me I'll find mercy and grace from you. But when I think about the culture of death I'm surrounded by, the wars that rage around the world, the persecution of your people, and *(tell God about the other things in your life He has brought to mind for which you lament)*, where are you, God? How can you tolerate it continuing day after day and year after year? Will I ever run out of tears for this heartache? *(Now stop and remember a situation in your life where God has met you in your pain. Thank Him for this.)* Faithful Father, I remember how good and true you are. What a tender Shepherd you are! So please help again as I cry to you today. Help my unbelief!

## **MAY 24 (NUMBERS 33, PSALM 78:1-39)**

O God faithful generation after generation, you have taken me, my family, and my church family by the hand on a journey we never could have seen or planned. You have always led us and provided for us even when we didn't trust you or follow your ways; you are so gracious and forgiving! So, Father, help us to pass a clear vision of you to the next generation that they, too, might trust and follow you all the days of their lives. You have entrusted to our care so many precious little ones – some of them now teenagers, others have moved away from home – Father, keep working in their hearts, keep calling them to yourself, keep showing your covenant faithfulness in ways beyond what we deserve! And please make us faithful. We don't pray for them as we should; we don't repent to them as we should; we don't share stories of your greatness and grace with them as we should. Make us faithful for your sake and theirs. Amen.

## **MAY 25 (NUMBERS 34, PSALM 78:40-72)**

Certainly, Father, you have been faithful to your people even when we have been unfaithful to you. The stories of your powerful deliverance from oppressors out of Egypt remind me that you have conquered sin and Satan and death to deliver me from the selfish destruction my heart was headed toward. The careful descriptions of the land you provided for your people even after they failed to trust you remind me that you have cared for me materially, cared for our church family financially, and cared for all of us spiritually so that we would know you, the One who ultimately gives us life. The stories of Moses and David remind me that you continue to raise up imperfect people to shepherd my heart and lead me to you – what a great kindness from you since you know my wandering heart so well. I praise you for being my Good Shepherd, my mighty King, and my faithful Father all the days of my life! Glory to Jesus, Amen.

## **MAY 26 (NUMBERS 35, PSALM 79)**

Lord and Giver of Life, you value those you've made in your image so much more than I am sometimes mindful of. You want me to treat life carefully, to defend life passionately, to protect life intentionally. The cities of refuge were small pictures of the refuge you offer even the worst of sinners and the justice you want your people to pursue even in the most tragic of circumstances. God, would you make my heart and life a reflection of that refuge to others who are hurting and whose lives are being devalued or discarded – from the womb to the tomb. From the youngest to the oldest, the richest to the poorest, the most guilty to the most innocent, might I love and demonstrate your heart to all those around me. After all, it's no longer a piece of land that you inhabit; it's your people; it's me. May the holiness of that reality sober me and strengthen me for living to reflect your image day by day. In Jesus' name, Amen.

## **MAY 27 (NUMBERS 36, PSALM 80)**

Restore us, O Lord God of hosts! Let your face shine, that we may be saved! What a beautiful prayer, Father, that reminds me my hope is in you. Your face shining is like the sun at full strength, yet your grace is such that I'm not consumed. You lead me beside green pastures and still waters to restore my soul, O God of my salvation. You're not just the God of my salvation once but always; you keep helping me stand so that I will not fall against Satan's attacks, the overwhelming darkness of this world, or the depressing shame of my heart. Keep my heart coming back to you for help rather than running anywhere else. Remind me that your face shining on me is my greatest joy because you see all the way through me – every thought, every word, every deed, every desire – and still shine grace and salvation into me over and over. What sweet blessing is found in your face shining on me – blessed benediction! Amen.

## **MAY 28 (DEUTERONOMY 1, PSALM 81-82)**

I am grieved, God of compassion and Father of mercies, that I and so many human leaders fail to pursue justice for the weak and fatherless, to defend the afflicted and destitute, to rescue the weak and needy. *(Confess to God where you see the poor and needy overlooked or oppressed in our society and/or in your own heart.)* Give us your eyes to see them, Father. Give us your ears to hear them, Father. Give us your heart to love them, Father. Help me to know what practical, tangible love can look like and where you have called me to reflect your heart of compassion, justice, and mercy to people in my neighborhood, city, and world. Ultimately, God, help me to trust you when I see injustice, oppression, and leaders who neglect the weak and needy. You are the Judge of all the earth, and I do trust that you will do right. Would you even use me in setting to right one person or one place in your kingdom? For Jesus' sake, Amen.

## **MAY 29 (DEUTERONOMY 2, PSALM 83-84)**

Heavenly Father, you who are near to all who call on you, indeed it is better to be with you than to be anywhere else! You, Father, are a place where prayers are heard, where the weakest are welcome, where the lonely find a home, where the weary and burdened find rest, where grace and mercy are constant gifts, where peace and joy are abundant and unending. Slow me down with you today, Holy God, that I might grasp the fullness of joy in your presence and not be chasing it anywhere else. When you seem distant today, draw my heart back close to you that I may know the security of trusting the One who is my shield and my salvation. You have told me that you will give me everything I need today – everything to walk with you, everything to walk in the good works you've prepared for me, everything to know true satisfaction. So thank you, Father, for making your home in me so I can be always in your presence through Jesus, Amen.

## **MAY 30 (DEUTERONOMY 3, PSALM 85)**

Faithful God, it is good, right, and needed for us as your people to remember your work through our journeys and our stories. I need to remember and thank you for the forgiveness of my sins generally and specifically, for the provision and protection you have given me when I didn't know what to do or what was coming next in my life, for your steadfast love that greets me each morning with fresh mercies that are beyond what I deserve. *(Take a few minutes to recount the goodness of God in your life personally and to thank Him for his kind faithfulness in so many ways.)* I know if I am to live with you the way you've called me to today, I need to remember to trust you, to follow your commands, and to share your goals. So remind my heart again today of the goodness of your Word, of the glory of your Son, of the grace of your commandments that orient my confused and wandering heart. Guide me anew through Jesus, I pray. Amen.

## **MAY 31 (DEUTERONOMY 4, PSALM 86-87)**

Beautiful, true, and living God, my heart is set right when I begin with who you are – the God who never changes no matter what changes in my life. So with the psalmist today, I rejoice that you are MY God – I am yours, and you are mine. You are good and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to the point that I never need wonder if you've run out. You hear the cries of the needy, the troubled, the poor, so I can always count on you. No other god, leader, or power is like you, who alone made the nations and controls all things. You are great and do wondrous things, including delivering my guilty soul from certain judgment. You are merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness – all the time, from your deepest heart, to the biggest failure. You are the One who truly helps and comforts me. God, truly to whom else could I turn? My day, my struggles, my priorities are yours – I am yours. Amen.
