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AUGUST 1 (JUDGES 15, ACTS 19)

Great and awesome God, I worship you as the one true God, the Creator of the heavens and the earth, the Ruler over every person and every place, including me. Forgive me for the idols I all too regularly put in place of you in the way I think and live. I chase prosperity and success as though they will ultimately fulfill me. I chase pleasure and possessions as though there is no greater delight. I chase fame and comfort as though the highest form of worship is to worship myself and my own life. Forgive me, Father. Tear these idols out from my heart again today and reign there as King. Have mercy on my wandering heart and give me grace to see Jesus more clearly and more beautifully today. Renew my single-hearted devotion that I may live daily and love others and leave all else in this world in order to rest in and follow Jesus. May no one and nothing else besides you reign on the throne of my heart today. In the name of my King, Amen.

AUGUST 2 ANGELA (JUDGES 16, ACTS 20)

Heavenly Father, Holy Spirit, and King Jesus, Head of your Church, I pray today for your Church and especially her leaders. They are fallible, yet you so graciously work even through their brokenness and failures as you did with Samson. Continue to strengthen them by your grace with hearts that quickly and often turn back to you in repentance and long to celebrate the defeat of your enemies and the advance of your kingdom. Holy Spirit, may the elders of Southwood grow in love for you and in lives of obedience to your Word. Good Shepherd, give them hearts to love and care for your sheep that you purchased with your blood. Keep them faithful in fending off the wolves who would come to attack your sheep. Give them endurance like Paul to continue speaking and good news of Jesus in dependence upon his grace. Grow our love for them and their love for us, your people. In the mighty name of the great King, Amen.

AUGUST 3 (JUDGES 17, ACTS 21)

God, thank you that you direct the steps of your people one day and one place at a time. In this new season of school, church ministry, and life, direct my steps to live for your glory and make known the greatness of your grace to all around me. Help me, Father, not to be driven by the tyranny of the urgent, not to begin my schedule for this fall with my own commitments, not to assume anything must happen except a life submitted to Christ in all things. O how I need your help with this endeavor! Give me your eyes to see every new classmate as deserving of your love and in need of friendship. Give me your mind to know how best to use my free time to order my relationship with you as my top priority. Give me your heart to love my neighbor as myself even when it's inconvenient for me to do so. Show me, Father, new opportunities in this new season and give me the boldness to live for you in every one of them. Help me! Amen.

AUGUST 4 (JUDGES 18, ACTS 22)

Great God and King, the One who rules and reigns today and forever, forgive us for the many ways I deny your sovereign authority in my life. I neglect your Word in favor of my own competency to manage my days. I chase after idols to fulfill me and run into many silly obsessions to satisfy my appetites. I even pretend to be independently sufficient and secure when you alone can direct my paths in peace. Bring my heart back to you again today, King Jesus. Remind me of your loving rule. Remind me of your trustworthy promises. Remind me of your gracious lovingkindness that redeems even idolaters like Paul – who worked against you – into your family and into key positions in your mission in the world. Might I learn, like him, that the wonder of serving you as my King is that you don't demand sacrifice from me before giving your sacrifice for me. What an amazing King! Might I live for you today. Amen.

AUGUST 5 (JUDGES 19, ACTS 23)

Gracious God, on this day when many of our kids return to school, I pray for the city of Huntsville, for her leaders and teachers, for her families and students. God, please bless the year ahead of them. Bless the children today who feel alone, overwhelmed, or left-out. Send them friends. Give your children eyes to see them and hearts to love them. May this school year be a blessing to our entire community. And Father, give our teachers and students boldness to testify to your goodness and grace in the way they love, the way they speak, the way they relate to those at school with them in different settings. May the love of Jesus be experienced even and especially by those who don't know Him. As we learn your truth, might we be strengthened to share it and encouraged to glorify you with it. You know our weakness and capacity for wickedness is great; we know your goodness and capacity to bless is greater. So help us. Amen!

AUGUST 6 (JUDGES 20, ACTS 24)

(Before you talk to God, contemplate the situation Paul finds himself in, where he has to testify about Jesus before powerful people who hold his life in their hands. How would you react, and what would you be able to say? How would you ask for God's help in the places He calls you to testify about Jesus?) Holy Father, I need your help today with my fear of man – I so desperately want them to approve of me and to live at peace with me. Help me love the name and honor of Jesus more than I love the honor of my own name. Holy Son, I need your help today with my selfish neglect – I so naturally want only my own comfort. Help me be willing to sacrifice my time and plans to tell others around me about your glory. And Holy Spirit, I need your help today with my fear of failure – I so worry that I won't know what to say or will embarrass myself. Give me the faith to trust your promise to give me words when asked. I trust you. Amen.

AUGUST 7 (JUDGES 21, ACTS 25)

God of all, Creator of heaven and earth, King over the great and the small, I am grieved to read of so many awful acts of your people in the time of the judges when they followed no king and everyone did what was right in his own eyes. Please make my heart grieve likewise for the self-serving, self-ruling, self-relying actions I take day after day. I so naturally feel I should direct my own steps when you have promised to do so faithfully and perfectly. I so often identify my own problems and strategize my own solutions. I so slowly come to you in prayer and seek your direction and intervention in my life. Forgive me, great King and loving Father! I am capable of so much evil in this world, but you have given me new life and a new heart so that I am capable of so much good now – even equipped for specific good works you have prepared for me! So give me grace to walk in them, with you, today. In Jesus' matchless name, Amen.

AUGUST 8 (RUTH 1, ACTS 26)

Thank you, Jesus, for the good news of your grace to us! Thank you for coming to suffer our pain and to die in our place. Praise you for rising from the dead victorious, conquering, life-giving – and praise you that you were the firstfruits, that because you rose from the dead so will I and many others! You indeed are the light of the world, Jesus, the hope of the nations, and the Savior of all who trust in you. So I do trust you, I do thank you, and I do rejoice in the light and life you have brought to me by your suffering death and triumphant resurrection. I pray that the good news of your grace will be shared with every king in every land. I pray you would use me to speak its wonder and hope to those grieving and longing for comfort like Naomi. I pray that my actions and my words would testify to a living Savior in whose name there is always hope. Send me even today, Lord Jesus, as an ambassador of your Gospel. Amen.

AUGUST 9 (RUTH 2, ACTS 27)

Just and merciful God, what a beautiful picture of your lovingkindness and covenant love Boaz is! Certainly it is your gracious laws that provide so generously for the foreigner, the outcast, and the stranger. And how beautiful it is to see your good design followed by your people! Help me to trust your Word and follow your plan even today. I thank you for the compassionate heart that sees Ruth personally, knows Naomi's plight deeply, and both provides and protects these hurting women in their distress. O how you love and care for your people! And of course, Father, I thank you for the glimpse of my kinsman redeemer – the Savior who came near to me in order to buy me back into relationship with you even at the cost of his own precious blood. Jesus gives me the greatest reminder that your kindness will not forsake me in life or in death; in fact, it will keep pursuing me every day forever. Thank you, gracious Father! Amen.

AUGUST 10 (RUTH 3-4, ACTS 28)

Gracious God, you always provide so generously for your people – thank you! You met Ruth and Naomi, you met Paul and his companions, and you meet me and my family to supply our deepest needs according to your glorious riches. *(Take a couple minutes to ponder specific ways God has provided for you physically and spiritually and give Him specific thanks for his kindness to you.)* Your promises, your laws, and your people are all ways in which you pour blessing into the life of desperately needy people like me. As grateful as I am today that the good news of Jesus has gone to the Gentiles, I pray especially today for your people, the Jews. Please, Father, give them eyes to see and hearts to believe the wonder of Jesus the Messiah and turn in faith to the One who fulfills all their hopes. Bring them in, gracious Savior, and keep saving Gentiles from every tribe, tongue, people, and nation – for the glory of Jesus, Amen.

AUGUST 11 (I SAMUEL 1, ROMANS 1)

O God who hears and answers prayer, how Hannah's story inspires me to bring my desperate cries to your attentive and all-powerful presence. Thank you for hearing all my prayers and answering what I ask for or what I would ask for if I knew everything you know. I really do trust that you know best, Father, so give me again what you know I need. After all, the Gospel of Jesus is what I most needed, and you gave it to me for my joy and my salvation through the work of your Son. Grow my faith today in the power of the Gospel to change my heart and transform my selfish inclinations to selfless love. Grow my faith today in the power of the Gospel to change the hearts of my neighbors so that I will share it with boldness and without shame. Grow my faith today in the power of the Gospel to change this world and bring reconciliation, peace, and hope to everyone everywhere. In the powerful name of Jesus, Amen.

AUGUST 12 (I SAMUEL 2, ROMANS 2)

God, whose kindness leads me to repentance, whose forgiveness leads me to confession of sin, whose grace leads me to honest acknowledgement of how desperately I need you, I bow before you this morning in humble prayer. *(Spend a few minutes considering your specific sin that you must confess to God, your particular weaknesses that cause you to depend on God's strength, your specific needs today that drive you to seek God's help.)* Gracious Father, like Hannah I rejoice in your character as a God who is a rock for unstable people like me – thank you that I can depend upon you! I rejoice in your character as a God raises the poor from the dust and the needy from the ash heap – thank you that you rescue me time and time again! I rejoice in your character as a God who guards the feet of his people who like me so need his direction – thank you for giving me your Word to light my path even today! What a wonderful God you are!

AUGUST 13 (I SAMUEL 3, ROMANS 3)

God who speaks to us in his Word, help me open the Bible regularly and always with the heart of Samuel to say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Give me that delight to know you more and walk in your ways each day. Even, gracious Father, make me willing to have my sinful heart exposed because I sin and fall short of your glory in so many ways every day (*tell God about some of the ways you see your sin exposed lately*). But especially, righteous God, help me not to miss your promised provision for unrighteous people like me – a gift! Grace! Alien righteousness! – help me not to forget that it is mine through the works of Jesus rather than my own performance. Help me to hear your voice calling me "righteous" louder than the voices of my critics or my own heart calling me "failure." Help me sit at your feet to receive your forgiveness and the love of a Father afresh today. Speak, Lord; I'm listening again. Amen.

AUGUST 14 (I SAMUEL 4, ROMANS 4)

Righteous God, who alone does what is right in all the earth, who alone can make sinners like me right with Him, thank you for counting me righteous and bringing me home through faith in Jesus! How amazing it is that you sent your Son to die for my trespasses and rise for my justification – that what happened over 2,000 years ago secured my relationship with you once and for all and forever! Thank you, Father, that it was not only Abraham who was counted righteous because he believed you but also us today who believe Jesus is Lord who are counted righteous because of his righteousness. Thank you for that gift I can never repay. Thank you for your Spirit sent to work faith in me. Thank you for the new relationship with you that can never be taken away from me because Jesus earned it, not me. What a gracious and merciful God we serve! May I live today in the joy and freedom of your salvation. In Jesus' name, Amen.

AUGUST 15 (I SAMUEL 5-6, ROMANS 5)

I praise you, one true and living God, because there is no other like you. All the false gods and idols bow before you – what a humorous but humbling picture of the difference between idols made from human hands or hearts and the God who made this whole universe and everyone in it! May the idols of my heart bow before you today – even crashing down to where I behold the glory and power and worth of the one true God afresh and live in the light of your glory and grace. Indeed, in spite of my unworthiness, my idolatry, even my rebellion against you, you put your unparalleled love and unmatched mercy on display in sending your Son to die for me – to give me life, to achieve peace for me with you, to bring me home forever. Thank you, Jesus, for your great act of love even while I was your enemy. May I join the false gods in bowing before you today with all of me and all you've given me to worship you alone. Amen.

AUGUST 16 (I SAMUEL 7-8, ROMANS 6)

(Reflect for a few minutes on a specific time or two in your life that you have seen God provide for you. Samuel set a stone up as an Ebenezer, a tangible reminder of God's care for his people. You can even sing that second stanza of "Come, Thou Fount": "Here I raise my Ebenezer; hither by Thy help I've come" or in some other way thank God and ask Him to help you trust Him afresh and not forget his kindness to you.) Heavenly Father, indeed over and over you have been so, so good to me ... thank you! In addition to all the other moments I recall, I consider the cross and empty tomb of Jesus, where you provided ultimate protection for me and for all your people. What a joy to know that because He is alive forever, I will live forever with Him as well! Thank you, God, for this gift of your grace when all I deserved from you was death. Certainly I will be raised with Him. Certainly! What great hope and confidence! Here I raise my Ebenezer. Amen.

AUGUST 17 (I SAMUEL 9, ROMANS 7)

O merciful God who is the Helper of the helpless, please continue to rescue me from myself! I so resonate with Paul's experience of finding myself doing the things I do not want to do. Even just recently I determined never to *(tell God something specific you decided)* and then found myself falling into *(tell God what it looked like when you fell again)* soon thereafter. Like an addict running back to the thing he thinks will soothe him, I stumble into my sin so regularly and naturally. Like Israel demanding a king like the nations and thinking they would find life apart from God's leadership of them, I seem stuck on my own sinful desires and my own ideas for fulfillment. Deliver me, O my God! I long for the day when I am fully and finally free of this battle against sin. In the meantime, thank you for Jesus who has delivered me and will finish his work of deliverance and restoration in me forever. May that day come quickly! Amen.

AUGUST 18 (I SAMUEL 10, ROMANS 8)

What wonder, what security, what joy, O my God! Nothing can separate me from your love; nothing can come into my life except your Sovereign hand is working it for my good; nothing can condemn me or keep me from eternal glory with you! Hallelujah! Help my heart grasp even the fringes of the garment of these high and holy truths – indeed, gracious Father, they seem too good to be true. I bring to you now the failures in my life, the problems in the world, the trials in my story, that I struggle to trust you with (*tell God about the situations that you tend to try to control, that cause you to worry, that make you fearful*). In all these things, Jesus, you have saved me. In all these things, Spirit, you protect and comfort me. Through all these things, Father, you promise to bring me home – and what greater comfort could there be than to know that you are with me and I will always be with you. Glory, thanks, and worship be to you! Amen.

AUGUST 19 (I SAMUEL 11, ROMANS 9)

Mighty God, I give you thanks and praise today for your sovereign mercy, for rescuing me from certain destruction and granting me assured glory forever! (*Spend a few moments contemplating the way God called you to Himself and rescued you from yourself and your sin.*) God, indeed you called me "Beloved" when I was not even one of your people; indeed you adopted me as your son when I was not naturally one of yours; indeed you showed mercy to me by withholding your just wrath from me and pouring it out on Jesus instead. How could I ever thank you enough? What a joy it is to be yours and to know that you delight even right now to hear my prayers and the cries of my heart! May I ever delight in belonging to you, being with you, and behaving like you more and more. Continue to pour out your sovereign mercy upon me, for without it I am without hope but with it I have unending hope. Thank you, Father!

AUGUST 20 (I SAMUEL 12, ROMANS 10)

Faithful God, Samuel's words to your people remind me of how gracious you are to us in spite of our rebellion – and how desperate we are for you to intervene in our desire to rule our own lives. And so I see even more how beautiful are the feet of those who bring the good news of Jesus to the nations! Make the feet of our partners around the world beautiful to you and to the people where you've sent them. Encourage Mint and Adair as they labor in the darkness of Bangkok and Munich; sustain the Lewis and Futo families as they plant churches and love neighbors in Ireland and Hungary; strengthen the Besses as they minister to so many in Togo; give the Sarrans perseverance as their church grows and invites others to join them in France; expand the impact of Saji and Mony Lukos throughout India; continue to shine your light on college campuses through RUF ministers and interns. Thank you for them in Jesus' name, Amen.

AUGUST 21 (I SAMUEL 13, ROMANS 11)

O wise God, who has chosen to include even us graciously and gloriously among his beloved people, forgive us when we prefer our own rule to yours. Our desire for an impressive, efficient, strong king “like the nations” to lead us often leads us to follow men who don’t lead us in your ways. What’s worse, Father, is that we often don’t mind following them as long as they look and sound the part, as long as they give us what we long for, as long as we feel comfortable in living as we please. Forgive us, Father, for longing for anything or anyone more than we long to love and serve and enjoy you. Forgive us, King Jesus, for bowing the knee first to any other king in our hearts. Forgive us, Spirit, for spurning your life-giving conviction and insisting on our own ways. We plead for your help and your restoration of us to following you and your Word first and to having leaders after your own heart who lead us in honoring you. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

AUGUST 22 (I SAMUEL 14, ROMANS 12)

Jesus, my Savior and Lord, in your great mercy you have given your life in my place, forgiven me debts I couldn't repay, and welcomed me in where I don't belong. All that I am and have is yours – I eagerly sacrifice my own agendas and plans to live for you today. In fact, Holy Spirit, I ask you to conform me not to the priorities of this world but instead to the likeness of Christ – that I may think, desire, and live according to God's will. Help me to use my gifts to serve others rather than promote myself. Help me to love others sincerely and deeply ahead of myself. Help me to depend on you, especially in the difficulties of today rather than relying on my own strength. Help me to rejoice with brothers and sisters in your kindness to them. Help me to weep with those who are hurting. Help me to be drawn to those who are lowly rather than to those who make me look good. Take my life and let it be consecrated, Lord, to Thee. Amen.

AUGUST 23 (I SAMUEL 15, ROMANS 13)

(Begin by listing those God has put in authority over you locally, nationally, and even professionally. Some of them may follow God more closely and others, like Saul or Nero, not obey Him in particularly harmful ways. How does this impact your prayers for them and attitude toward them?) Mighty King, who brings rulers to power and holds the king's heart in his hands, thank you that I can trust you to be holding all things together by the word of your power. Thank you that no one can thwart you or stand against you and win. So help me to trust you with those you have allowed to be in authority over me. Protect them from the pride so often connected to power. Guide them in wisdom for my good and the good of my neighbors. Grant them justice in their decisions and especially sensitivity to those being mistreated and neglected under their care. Help me submit to them appropriately and to King Jesus ultimately. Amen.

AUGUST 24 (I SAMUEL 16, ROMANS 14)

(Today begin by considering those God has put in authority over you within his Church as leaders of his people. What does God prioritize for them, and does that match what you hope and pray for on their behalf?) Father, you have called imperfect and weak people, even young shepherd boys like David, to lead your people. I bring before you my pastors, my elders, my Grace Group leaders, my teachers, my team leaders, my church staff. Would you guard their hearts that they might be like yours, that they might be shaped into those with godly character who love what you love and live like you live, Jesus. Forgive me when I long for them to be more outwardly impressive, worldly wise, or humanly successful. Help me be an encourager of their faith in you and their relationship with you. Remind me to pray for them often. Help them to lead me in loving and following you above all else. In the name of Jesus, the true King of his people, Amen.

AUGUST 25 (I SAMUEL 17, ROMANS 15)

God of hope, would you indeed fill us with joy and peace as we trust in you so that we your people may abound in hope. I long for that, Father – to live a life overflowing with hope in every circumstance, that all around me may notice the stability, the confidence, the eternal perspective I have no matter what comes into my life. Give me the zeal of David to fight for the honor of your name in the face of any and all threats. But especially give me the joy and passion for living in the victory of great David's greater Son, who has defeated sin and death for me once and for all so that I may rush forward and plunder Satan's camp. What hope I have in Christ – hope in life and in death! Thank you for giving Him the victory over the grave so that I may have the victory over my greatest enemies both forever and today. May I be a beacon of such hope even today as I serve the poor, love the lonely, and share with the lost. Amen.

AUGUST 26 (I SAMUEL 18, ROMANS 16)

God, I'm struck today by the value of godly and faithful friends – of the deep bond between David and Jonathan, of the gospel partnership between Paul and so many brothers and sisters. Help me to be a friend who is loyal even in the face of costly relationships. Help me be a friend who is wise when counsel is needed. Help me be a friend who inspires Christ-honoring living in my friends in every circumstance. Indeed, gracious God, would you be so kind as to give me friends like that in my life more and more. Create in your Church a community of friends who deepen each other's love for life, enjoyment of your creation, and desperation for your grace. Give the gift of such priceless friendships especially to our young people in a world of disconnection and isolation. And especially, Father, thank you for the friend who sticks closer than a brother – even Jesus, who in unparalleled loyalty laid down his life for his friends. Amen.

AUGUST 27 (I SAMUEL 19, I CORINTHAINS 1)

Jesus, King and Head of your Church, I pray for my church today. Would you unite us in one heart to exalt the name of Jesus, to preach Christ crucified in all of our words and deeds, to rejoice in your grace that has taken foolish nobodies like us and in Jesus given us wisdom, holiness, and redemption. Put to death, mighty King, any party spirit, any loyalty to human leaders that would divide our flock. Bring to life, gracious King, a humility and love for one another that is unmatched in our community and highlights for all around us the wonder and beauty of your love. Forgive our weaknesses – you know they are many! But make us strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus – that it may be clear to all that our power rests in you and not in ourselves. We long to see your name proclaimed, trusted, and exalted throughout our city and throughout this world – that all may find their hope in our crucified Savior. Amen.

AUGUST 28 (I SAMUEL 20, I CORINTHIANS 2)

God, I confess that my heart so often longs to be thought of by others as great, wise, or powerful. I want others to consider me worthy of respect and honor. I want others to speak of me with value and praise. Yet my Savior endured shame willingly, received mockery when He didn't deserve it, suffered pain in my place. O help me be more concerned about the honor of his reputation than my own, about the praise of his name rather than my own. Indeed, gracious Spirit, grow the fruit of humility in me that I might delight even and especially when my weakness shows the power of King Jesus. Help me to lead with repentance in my relationships with outsiders – that they might not be confused about my message, that they may not think they need to be more like me but rather more like Jesus. Give them hope not in having a wise friend but in having a wise and strong and good Savior. In his great name alone I pray, Amen.

AUGUST 29 (I SAMUEL 21-22, I CORINTHIANS 3)

Gracious Jesus, the God of my salvation and the only firm foundation on which my life can be built, I worship you and thank you today that I don't need to start building my security from the ground up again; instead, I have a solid rock, an anchor that holds in every storm of life and carries me through into eternity. Thank you for sending your Spirit to dwell within me even now. What a remarkable thought that I am inhabited by the God of the universe – He makes Himself to dwell with the lowly, even with me! You protect me, you love me, you have made me holy – in fact, you are also making me holy because holy things are holy thanks to the presence of God in them. You are renovating me because you will live in me forever. Holy Spirit, do your holy work in me that I may be the person you made me to be in the true likeness of my good and gracious King. Thank you for patiently and unfailingly making your home with me. Amen.

AUGUST 30 (I SAMUEL 23, I CORINTHIANS 4)

My God, my Rock and Fortress, my Stronghold and Deliverer, you are the One in whom I rest and am utterly secure. Even with all the armies of the kingdom at his disposal, Saul couldn't find David because God did not give him into his hand. Hide me, Father, in the cleft of your hand in every storm and against every temptation. In fact, deliver me from evil and from the attacks of the Evil One, who would wish my harm and seek to devour me – to separate me once and for all from you. May it never be! Greater is He who is in me than he who is in the world. Today is your day, a day you have given me for Sabbath to remember that you alone, Father, are my priority. Nothing and no one else can attract my heart's attention or my mouth's praise. Give me your eyes to see a brother or sister today who needs the encouragement of your divine protection, and may I be to him or her a taste of your safety, refuge, and love. For Jesus' sake I pray, Amen.

AUGUST 31 (I SAMUEL 24, I CORINTHIANS 5)

(Consider which challenge is more difficult for you: having the boldness to confront sin in a brother or sister or having the mercy to seek the restoration of repentant sinners. Ask God to show you his heart and shape yours more like his.) Lord Jesus, King and Head of your Church, make our local body here at Southwood increasingly reflective of the pure and beautiful Bride you have redeemed us to be. We are capable of so much worse sin than we would like to admit. We harbor all sorts of pride, lust, selfish motives, apathy, anger, and greed. We fail to seek first your kingdom and your righteousness over and over. Please help us not to back away from confronting sin among us for the sake of the purity of your Bride. Please help us not to give up on anyone or be ashamed of chasing the wandering sinner who needs to be restored.
