THE BIBLE & PRAYER

Delighting in our relationship with God involves both listening to Him speak and speaking to Him. Reading God's living and active Word to hear Him often prompts our hearts because we are encouraged, challenged, convicted, or awestruck. Part of relationship is then taking the time to marvel, to contemplate, to consider our hearts and lives in light of his Word. These prayers are based off some of the daily Scripture readings and are intended as aides to that end of slowing down to wonder, to confess, to rejoice before the God who promises He hears when we speak to Him—and that even when we don't know the words to say, He intercedes for us—what a gracious Father we have!

JULY 1 (JOSHUA 3, PSALM 126-128)

Faithful Father, remind me right now how dependent I am upon you. I can't build without your strength, I can't protect without your provision, I can't rest without your grace. So let me not be anxious; rather, help me to trust you. And Father, perhaps the hardest thing with which to trust you is our children. The children of my family, of my church family, of my community, are gifts from you – part of covenant blessings from a God who is faithful one generation after another. So help us to treat them as the blessings they are – offering thanks to you, finding delight in them, and trusting their care to you as One who never lets them go. Right now I specifically bring before you these children you have placed on my heart (*Tell God by name children who are precious gifts to you in any context of your life. Thank Him for those children and ask for grace to trust Him with those children.*) Thank you, Good Father. Amen.

JULY 2 (JOSHUA 4, PSALM 129-131)

Miracle-working God, the crossing of the Jordan was nothing short of miraculous. As the priests stepped into the flood-level river carrying the ark of the covenant, you held back the waters and allowed 2–3 million Israelites to cross on dry ground. Throughout the long crossing, you faithfully protected your people down to the very last person. Thank you for powerfully delivering me from oppression (consider at least your sin and possibly other unjust suffering you've endured as you thank Him). Thank you for powerfully delivering me to freedom (consider freedom from sin and to righteousness in so many ways as you thank Him). You alone could defeat my enemies and set me free, so thank you! Thank you, Father, for ultimately delivering me through your Son, Jesus, in whom I find my true freedom and ultimate life. Might I live in the joy of his freedom today. I ask you and thank you in his name, Amen.

JULY 3 (JOSHUA 5, PSALM 132-134)

Our Father in heaven, how good it is to be your child! What a blessing it is to have a Father who is so gracious, faithful, and generous to his children! Now by faith in Jesus I have become a part of a family, adopted by my Heavenly Father, so that I have countless brothers and sisters with whom you want me to live in unity. So help us, gracious God, to celebrate that in spite of our many differences, we have the same Father, our hope is in the same elder Brother who gave his life for us, and our power for life today is from the same Spirit you give us. Bring unity among our church family. Bring unity within our leadership teams. Bring unity throughout our Grace Groups. Bring unity within our marriages. Bring unity across denominations and nations. Bring unity within godly friendships. Father, it is to your glory and our good that we live together in unity, so help me forgive, reconcile, and love as I have been loved. For Jesus' sake, Amen.

JULY 4 (JOSHUA 6, PSALM 135-136)

(Spend a few minutes actually writing down some of the evidences of God's steadfast love in your life, in our nation, and in his world for which you give Him thanks. Then reflect on how all good things are truly gifts from the generous Giver and give Him thanks for them.)

God whose love is unfailing and unending, thank you for all you have done for me personally with your mighty hand and outstretched arm. You have defeated sin, welcomed me into your family, and empowered me with your constant presence. Especially today I give you thanks for 250 years of a nation that has received so many good gifts from you. Father, please make us mindful that your love (*not our exceptional nature*) is the source of all the good things about America. And as we thank you, make us repentant that we might turn back to you as a nation for all the things that don't reflect your heart for us. Give us both joy and humility, in Jesus' name. Amen.

JULY 5 (JOSHUA 7, PSALM 137-138)

Father, forgive me. The gravity of my sin and the consequences of my selfish disobedience often escape me. Forgive me for living as though sin is small and doesn't grieve your holy heart. Whether it was the defeat of Israel's army, the death of Achan's family, or the weeping of the exiled Israelites far from home, the impact of wandering from you and your Word was tragic – and it is for me, too, even when I can't see it. Give me a heart that hates my sin – not merely for its consequences but truly because it distances me from your heart, loving Father. (Take a minute to confess specific sin to God and ask Him to grow your hatred for it and your love for Him). May my hatred for sin and my sorrow over my rebellion against you drive me to love the cross of Christ more and more – the place my sin was dealt with once and for all, the place your love was most evident, the place my heart was restored to you. Thank you, Jesus!

JULY 6 (JOSHUA 8, PSALM 139)

God who searches me and knows me, there is nothing about me hidden from you – not even the things I hide from others and deny to myself. Not even the smallest sin, rebelling against your holiness, escapes your all-seeing eye and your divine justice. So call me out of my hiding as you did in the Garden of Eden when you came seeking and asking, “Where are you?” May I acknowledge before you the wickedness of my thoughts, the warped direction of my desires, the broken bent of my heart. But praise Jesus, there is an everlasting way now that can handle any grievous way in me! As much as I try to hide from you, there’s actually no one else safe to be exposed before like you. You have loved me and formed me even before I was born, and in Christ you will never stop. In fact, you will never love me any less, no matter what is uncovered about me. So help me live honestly in the light with you today, my God and King. Amen.

JULY 7 (JOSHUA 9, PSALM 140-141)

(In light of the prayer in Psalm 141 to “set a guard over my mouth,” reflect today on the ways you have spoken or failed to speak. When did you lack truthfulness? Whom did you hurt? What opportunities for sharing good news or encouragement did you miss? Now ask God to help you.) Gracious Father, how my lips reveal the wanderings of my heart! I have so often spoken words that tore down rather than built up, that drew attention to myself rather than to others, that were furthering my ends rather than yours. Forgive me and keep watch over the door of my lips. I want my words to be words of life; I want to be faithful to speak when you call me to speak – especially for the voiceless; I want to proclaim the excellencies of your name every time my mouth opens. So help me, Holy Spirit, that even a fresh glimpse of my shortcomings would be yet one more impetus toward Jesus. You know how desperately I need Him! Amen.

JULY 8 (NUMBERS 16, PSALM 52-54)

Faithful, covenant-keeping God, I will sing and think and speak of your steadfast love now and all the day! When I think only of my sin, I am overwhelmed – there is no part of me that relates to you the way that I should. When I consider my capacity for rebellion and self-promotion, I am humbled – I'm as capable as Korah of pushing myself forward and neglecting to trust God. When I dwell on your holy justice and hatred for sin, I am driven to my knees – I'm so deserving of your punishment if left to my own devices. So, Father, I will trust in your steadfast love forever and ever. I will trust that although my sins are like scarlet, you make them white as snow. I will trust that you are more loving toward me than I can imagine. I will trust that your love for me is based not on my being lovely but on your being loving. So today may every gift and every struggle drive me back to your steadfast love. Praise you, Jesus! Amen.

JULY 9 (JOSHUA 11, PSALM 144)

Indeed, gracious Father, blessed is the people whose God is the Lord! What a glorious reminder that we are dependent upon you for everything all the time! I ask this morning, Abba Father, for my daily bread and for the strength to provide for myself and my family as well as to look to the needs of those around us. I pray for my children, God who is faithful generation after generation, may they grow deep roots spiritually; would you surround them with friends who point them to you; may they know the unique people you have made them to be in your kingdom and find their place among your people on your mission. And Triune God, please continue to bless your Church. May she grow in unity and peace with one another. May our relationships with you become the engine of our lives together. May she be a light to the nations the way you designed us to be. Bless us, O our God! Amen.

JULY 10 (JOSHUA 12-13, PSALM 145)

(Spend a few minutes this morning praying for our Bangkok Missions Team as they, Lord willing, arrive in Thailand and begin their ministry there. Pray for God to work in and through Kelli Johnson, Katie Cantonwine, and Heather and Clara Morris as they work with our mission partner, Mint, and the women she ministers to there.) You are the one true and living God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. So I pray today that your greatness would be made known in every nation through your creation and especially through your servants who bear your Word and the good news of relationship with you through Jesus Christ. And I pray today that your greatness would be made known to every generation – that our meditating on your wondrous works would lead to our sharing of your gracious faithfulness with our kids, grandkids, covenant kids, and neighbors. Would indeed all flesh, every person everywhere, bless your holy name! Amen.

JULY 11 (JOSHUA 14-15, PSALM 146-147)

Heavenly Father, We praise you as the faithful God who keeps every promise. Just as you gave Caleb strength to follow you wholeheartedly and inherit the land you promised, help us to trust you with courageous faith and steadfast hearts. Give us confidence to walk in obedience, knowing that your plans are good and your timing is perfect. Lord, we put our hope in you alone. You are our Maker, our Helper, and our King forever. Thank you for your care for the weak, the hurting, and those who call upon you. You heal the brokenhearted and gather your people with tender love. Teach us to praise you daily for your power, wisdom, and faithfulness. Fill our homes with peace and our hearts with gratitude. Strengthen us to follow you wholeheartedly, like Caleb, and to rejoice in your goodness, like the psalmists who sang of your unfailing love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JULY 12 (JOSHUA 16-17, PSALM 148)

Praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth! The glories of your creation overwhelm me again today with awe and wonder at your majesty, creativity, and beauty. Yet you have determined the very boundaries of each of our lives – the places we should live, love, and serve; the roles we should play in caring for your creation; the ways we should be gifted to draw out the beauty and creativity of our Maker – surely we have a delightful inheritance in you and all your good gifts! Help me then, Father, to reflect your glory today where you have placed me in your world. Help me to remember that everything I get to steward today, everyone I get to meet today, and everywhere I get to go today are gifts from your good hand designed specifically and personally for me. Help me to sing the praises of your name with my lips, with my hands, with my heart, with my mind – that I may more truly love you with all I am. In your matchless name, Amen.

JULY 13 (JOSHUA 18-19, PSALM 149-150)

(When you read Psalm 150 about the praise of God, let it move your heart to sing praise to Him. Sing whatever song comes to mind – one you learned as a child or learned recently – that praises God for his greatness. Then meditate on even the simplest or highest reason for praising God – who He is, what He has done, why you love Him.)

Glorious God, Maker of all things visible and invisible, Giver of life and my next breath, with each breath you give me I will praise you! Singing seems only fitting for the greatness of your glory and grace. Had I a thousand tongues to sing, I could never utter all the praise you are due. So let me sing, sing, sing until every corner of the earth hears; let me love, love, love until every one of your creatures feels the warmth of your embrace; let me serve, serve, serve until every person made in your image experiences the value you intended. All praise to you, my God and King today and always. Amen.

JULY 14 (JOSHUA 20-21, ACTS 1)

Heavenly Father, I thank You for your faithfulness in keeping every promise. Just as you provided cities of refuge and gave Israel the inheritance you had spoken through Joshua, I praise you as our safe place, our protector, and our faithful God. Not one of Your good promises has ever failed. Lord Jesus, as your disciples waited faithfully for the gift you promised, teach me to wait on you with a trusting heart. Fill me with your Holy Spirit so that I may be a bold witness of your love wherever you send me. Help me to serve you with unity, prayer, and obedience, seeking your will above my own. Thank you that in Christ I have refuge from sin, grace for every failure, and hope for every tomorrow. Strengthen us to live as your people, confident in your promises and eager to share the good news of your salvation. May my life bring glory to you until the day you return. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JULY 15 (JOSHUA 22, ACTS 2)

Come, Holy Spirit, and fall fresh on me and on us, the holy people of God, as you did that day at Pentecost. Might I wait upon you, depend upon you, and live in your power – that I might speak the wonderful good news about Jesus with great boldness, that I might point others to the hope of repentance and forgiveness, that I might offer the hope of glory to otherwise hopeless souls and see your power bring revival and eternal life to those around me. And O Spirit, as you fill us together as your people, make us afresh committed to the Word of God and the Gospel of Jesus, make us afresh committed to one another in tangible love that leaves no brother or sister uncared for or unwelcome in our homes, make us afresh committed to seeing you add to our numbers those who are being saved by your powerful work to bring faith. Glory be to you, Spirit, with the Father and Son, one God, forever and ever, Amen.

JULY 16 (JOSHUA 23, ACTS 3)

Faithful God, who keeps his covenant generation after generation and fulfills all of his promises to us and our children, thank you that not one word has failed of all that you have promised me. Indeed, everything you promised has come to pass, and not one promise has failed. Your presence really has remained with me through the trials and sufferings of life (*thank God for a time you experienced his faithful care in a difficult season of life*). Your grace really is sufficient even in my weakness (*thank God for a time you found his power made perfect in your weakness, to sustain you when you didn't think you could go on*). Your love really never fails and has brought me into a never-ending relationship with you that is the true promised land (*thank God for the way in which He rescued you and called you to Himself and for the hope you have as a result*). May I live grateful, confident, and joyful in your unfailing promises. Amen.

JULY 17 (JOSHUA 24, ACTS 4)

Heavenly Father, we come before you with grateful hearts, remembering Your faithfulness through every generation. Just as Joshua called the people to choose whom they would serve, we declare today that we will serve you. Help us put away anything that competes for our devotion and follow you with wholehearted faith. Lord Jesus, give us the boldness of the believers in Acts. When we face opposition, fear, or uncertainty, fill us with your Holy Spirit and enable us to speak your truth with courage and love. Remind us that salvation is found in you alone and that your name is powerful above every name. Unite us as your people, giving us generous hearts that care for one another and seek your glory above our own. Let our homes, churches, and communities reflect your grace and faithfulness. Strengthen our commitment to you each day and empower us to be faithful witnesses until you return. In Jesus' name, Amen.

JULY 18 (JUDGES 1, ACTS 5)

Gracious God and Father, thank you that you continue to bless your people and build your Church even in the midst of our weaknesses and failures – for they are many. *(Take a couple minutes to confess to God the ways you personally are following your own agenda rather than his or using even your religion to benefit yourself rather than glorify God.)* Surely, God, we have more and more evidence that the way of Christianity is from you because it continues to flourish in spite of the foibles of its followers. How great indeed must the goodness and grace of Jesus be! So help me today to remember that your Church does not grow by human power, wisdom, or resources. Help me to submit my influence, my wisdom, and my resources to your sovereign direction because you are building your Church and you are gracious enough to let me be a part of that. What a glorious mission for which to live! Thanks you, Father! Amen.

JULY 19 (JUDGES 2, ACTS 6)

O Holy Father, I am so aware of my capacity to wander from you after my own desires and idols. Thank you for the gift of your Word and your Church to call my heart back to your truth over and over. I pray today especially for our deacons, who lead us in the gospel priority of caring for the needs of one another and those around us. May they indeed be “men full of the Spirit and of wisdom” as they follow Jesus and lead us. May we your people follow them cheerfully and sacrificially into caring for widows and orphans, the poor and the oppressed, the least and the left-out. Show me where I can serve alongside them. Keep me faithful to pray for them. Even, God, raise up more godly deacons that the ministry of your Word and prayer not be neglected nor the care of those in need. Help us be a church that shares the good news of Jesus in both word and deed, for the glory of his name, Amen.

JULY 20 (JUDGES 3, ACTS 7)

My good and gracious King, I come to you today trusting you as the greatest of all. Your ability to hold me is stronger than my fear of falling away. Your calling is stronger than the ability of men to thwart it. Your grace is more real than my misgivings. Your power is more real than my fear of having damaged my children. Your grace is stronger than my fear of hurting my spouse or friends. You are more real than my fears of the unknown. Your approval is greater than the disapproval of men that I fear. Your ability to unite is stronger than my ability to divide. You are more real than my fear of rejection. Your ability to renew me is greater than my weariness. Your ability to reconcile is greater than my ability to offend. Your sovereignty is greater than my ability to mess things up. Your ability to hold all things together is greater than my ability to break them apart. I bow before you and trust you with all my heart. Amen.

JULY 21 (JUDGES 4, ACTS 8)

Awesome God, praise you for how you deliver your people time again! In the midst of our repeated idolatry, when we are completely blind and don't see you at all, even as Saul looks on and approves of the death of your servants, you are preparing by your powerful grace to bring hope and life and a new direction for him. Thank you that your grace and power are still at work like that today – opening eyes, changing hearts, and transforming lives by the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Help me then, Father, to be led by your Spirit, to be living for your glory, to be loving your people the way you do. Work powerfully in my family, in my church, in my community that we might be convinced of our need for you and confident in your power to save. You are our deliverer. You are our rock of refuge. You are the God of our salvation. So I thank you and praise you and trust you today. In the mighty name of Jesus, Amen.

JULY 22 (JUDGES 5, ACTS 9)

Lord Jesus, the One who conquered all his and our enemies, the One who rose triumphant over sin, Satan, death, and the grave, may your name be exalted today as the King of your people and the Ruler of all the earth! What a wonder that you identify yourself with your people to the point that you asked Saul, who was attacking Christians, "Why do you persecute ME?" Surely you are with me when I'm discouraged, oppressed or unjustly attacked. And praise you Jesus for rescuing people like Saul, people like me, when we stand opposed to your purposes. You intervene, you change hearts, you transform lives – and the world is changed as a result! Give me faith never to consider anyone beyond the reach of your amazing grace. Give me boldness to pursue even the most hardened opponent of faith in you. Give me hope in my weakness and in the failure of others, because you never give up on me. Thank you, Jesus!

JULY 23 (JUDGES 6, ACTS 10)

(Stop for a minute to ponder the reality that most of us are Gentiles who have been grafted in to the people of God. Marvel at the grace of God to include you even when you didn't deserve his grace or forgiveness.) Thank you, Father! How wonderful it is that you have deigned to allow us to call you "Father!" Praise you for bringing the far off near, for welcoming the undeserving, for forgiving the failing. Your clear communication about everyone made in your image being clean and needing to hear the good news reflects a gracious and generous heart and inspires me to think that way about the people around me each day. O give me grace to forgive as you have forgiven me. Enlarge my heart, Father, that I may love with the breadth and depth of the love of Christ. Even if it costs me personally or professionally, may I sacrifice for my neighbors the way Jesus sacrificed for me. I ask for your help in his strong name, Amen.

JULY 24 (JUDGES 7, ACTS 11)

God, I confess I don't much enjoy the life of weakness and dependence, yet you are committed to helping me learn that I can trust you. I like to think my wisdom, my plans, my abilities, or my resources are vital to your kingdom advancing and my life flourishing when you have told me that your grace is sufficient and your power made perfect in my weakness. After all, you want to make sure I find you to be the glorious Father, the generous Provider, and the gracious Savior. Grow my faith, Mighty God, as you did that of Gideon by ruthlessly demonstrating both his need for you and your commitment to deliver your people as you promised. You always come through, and your faithfulness is from generation to generation so that I can trust you for myself as well as for my kids and my grandkids. When I am weak, then I am strong because my God is the strong One and I get the privilege of living as his child today. Thank you, Jesus!

JULY 25 (JUDGES 8, ACTS 12)

Gracious Father, you are a God who answers prayers and delivers his people time and time again. O help my little faith! Sometimes I'm like the people of Israel who go running after other gods as soon as my human leader is gone. Even more often I'm like the early Christians who commit to praying but can't believe God would answer their prayers so specifically and immediately. What a convicting realization! How much more would I pray if I knew how powerfully you work through the prayers of your people? Extend my faith, God, that I might come regularly in dependence upon you, that I might look expectantly for you to work beyond what I ask or imagine, and that I may be eager to give you glory for caring for me and those I love even better than I know to ask. Forgive my lack of faith, forgive my infrequent prayers, forgive my self-reliant heart. Astonish me again with your faithfulness. Amen.

JULY 26 (JUDGES 9, ACTS 13)

God who holds the whole world in his hands, thank you for sending missionaries to share the good news of Jesus with people in Huntsville and around the world. Thank you for our Thailand team and our youth missions team that have gotten to serve different people in different places, and thank you that our hope and confidence in the power of the Gospel to change hearts and lives is in your sovereign work rather than our own skill. As your sovereign grace blessed the preaching of Paul and Barnabas to the salvation of many, so bless the Lewises in Ireland, the Sarrans in France, the Lukoses in India, the Besses in Togo, Mint in Thailand, and many others who share the good news of our risen Savior with the world. Build your Church in many places, O God. Even use me where you have placed me because I know you have many people in the city of Huntsville appointed to eternal life. Work powerfully, O God mighty to save! Amen.

JULY 27 (JUDGES 10, ACTS 14)

Father, I'm struck today at how fickle the praise of man can often be. One day Paul and Barnabas are worshipped as gods, and the next day they are stoned and left for dead. Forgive me, Father, for bowing at that idol and desperately seeking my significance and value from the affirmation of other people. There I go again like your people, Israel, following you one day and back to my idols the next. It's such a deadly drug, sinister because it feels so good and seems so right to be liked by others. But it's my heart that twists good relationships to try to draw from them my ultimate worth. Keep me fed by the abundant grace and life that flow from your throne, from your handcrafting of me in your image, from your delight in singing over me because you love me. Fill my heart with joy in you, Jesus, that I might live for you and speak your name no matter what the cost and no matter what any man may say about me. Amen.

JULY 28 (JUDGES 11, ACTS 15)

Gracious Father, thank you for building your Church that the gates of Hell cannot stand against. Today I thank you for the gatherings of church leaders dating all the way back to the Jerusalem Council that have stood for the Gospel of grace and sought the extension of King Jesus' kingdom. I thank you in that line for the Reformers hundreds of years ago, who committed to the good news of salvation by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone, according to your Word. I thank you for those who have given their lives for this truth, who have worked to record it in confessions of faith and catechisms that still guide our hearts and minds, who have taken the message to distant lands. O God, make us faithful in our generation! Help the PCA, Southwood, and me personally to be inspired by your grace and passionate for the Great Commission to be taken up every day in every place for the glory of King Jesus, Amen.

JULY 29 (JUDGES 12, ACTS 16)

Jesus, thank you that your Church is built by the welcoming in of those who were previously left out. Paul was just months or years removed from praying prayers thanking God that he was not a Gentile, a woman, or a slave, when God showed him grace and sent him to Philippi. And then you started your church there with a godly woman in Lydia, a slave girl being mistreated by her owners and possessed by demons, and a Gentile jailer who was about to kill himself. How marvelous you are, Jesus! You have brought me and so many others who were far from you near by the blood of your cross. Would you help me to see and welcome others the way you see and welcome me? Remind me that the only thing we need is not something we do but something you give – “Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved” – thank you for pursuing me, for rescuing me, and for commissioning me in your name. Amen.

JULY 30 (JUDGES 13, ACTS 17)

Holy God, what a comfort it is to know that you have determined the exact times and places I would live! You have me right here, right now, for your kingdom purposes – to impact eternity by the way I live and love today. Help me grasp more of the grand dignity that gives to me while also grasping the deep rest that gives me in the God who is in charge and in control of me and everyone else around me. And Father, thank you that the primary reason you have placed me here and now is that I may know you, the One whom to know is life itself! Don't let me miss you today; don't let me rush by you today; don't let me neglect you for other pursuits or priorities in my calendar. I need you every hour, and you are indeed not far from me but very near – thank you, great Father! God, show me today even a small glimpse of why you have me right here, right now, and help me to grasp hold of it for your glory. Amen.

JULY 31 (JUDGES 14, ACTS 18)

(Meditate on the reality that God has many people in this city. While He speaks this word to Paul about Corinth, we know his heart to save means there are people in Huntsville who are God's people, even some who don't yet know Him. How does that encourage your heart with regard to evangelism with the people in your life? Reflect on specific people God might give you an open door with even today.)

God, thank you that your Word is powerful and that I need not be ashamed of the Gospel since it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes. So help me to live it and speak it that your people may hear the good news and trust you for their lives today and their eternal salvation. Help me know your Word more so that I may testify to it with more confidence and boldness. Help me to trust your sovereign grace that has already set your love upon people I know and love. Save them and use me, O God! Amen.
